

November 2016 - Bi-Lingual Wedding

We recently had a lovely and unusual wedding at St Peter's in that it was held in two languages - English and Spanish. The bride was from Spain and the groom England, and both had worked at Ashburnham Place.

I began planning thinking it would be easy, but actually it proved to be quite complicated. Do you translate everything for instance? How many words do you say in English before you hand over to the translator? I was surprised how many issues came up.

It is a legal service and therefore it is the vows made in English that are binding in law, but it was great that the couple and their friends and family could each hear the service and sing the hymns in their own "heart" language.

A wedding service normally takes about 40 minutes but in this case it lasted 1 hour 10 minutes because we were effectively reading the whole service twice. One unexpected and humorous moment came when I declared the couple "husband and wife" and they kissed. Immediately the translator repeated the words in Spanish and they kissed again!

Jesus loved a wedding and the one we have a record of in the Bible is at Cana in Galilee which was probably held in the Aramaic language of the day. The two friends getting married were about to suffer the embarrassment of running out of wine. Jesus helped them by turning water into wine.

Our native language is important to us but God will always understand us without words in whatever language.

Pot hole and Post spotting

At the end of September I went around the lanes with Sean our new Highways Steward and we looked at the areas that will be needing attention soon. We were assured of some action in the coming months. I think the worst patch of tarmac in the parish is at the Ponds Green end of Brownbread Street. This has been put in for re-laying before but it was turned down. I explained to Sean that he would be carried down Brownbread Street on the shoulders of locals if he could get that job done for us! Costain have taken over the contract for East Sussex Highways and, at the moment, they are seeking to go the extra (pothole filled) mile to please, so I will be pressing for some action in the weeks to come.

Although the pot holing season is mostly a winter affair as the water and ice take their toll, looking after our finger posts is an all year round pursuit. Thankfully, there is now a growing band of folks who have offered to get their bucket and sponge out and occasionally pamper our lovely wooden signs. We now even have a "Post pampering posse" that has been constituted in The Pound.... A sort of "workers collective" of local residents who are willing to look after their post! There are now just four left to be adopted and cared for:

1. Herrings Rd near Lakehurst Lane
2. Brigden Hill
3. Mansfield Cross
4. Near Slivericks

Let me know if you can help with any of these.

Finally: fly tipping. It has not been a good year for the parish in this respect and some areas regularly suffer from this anti-social behaviour. If you spot anything, there is a direct number at Rother DC to ring: 01424 787000. They respond pretty quickly so please call them if you are aware of any tipping. Don't think "someone else will, so I won't bother". Better reported again than not at all.

The organisation recently developed SafariSeat: a revolutionary all-terrain wheelchair. It is designed to be manufactured in developing countries and create sustainable local employment.

The Remembrance Day service will be held on Sunday 13th November, 10.50 am at the War Memorial. The service will be led by Revd Paul McVeagh, and refreshments, provided by Gill Ratcliffe and Carol Lovett, will be available afterwards inside the pavilion.

Planning Permission for the new village hall has seemed tantalisingly close for a very long time. Now, the Parish Council has appointed a planning consultant whose task it is to bring the application to a successful conclusion. Mike Pickup of Town & Country Planning Services has been appointed and will act as agent. Bernard Baker remains the scheme architect.

Roadworks advance notice – Darwell Hill and other parts of the road in the Netherfield area between Battle and Heathfield will be closed for much of January 2017 for resurfacing.

Issues

Rural broadband – if your provision of broadband is by BT please check your speed and send details with the first line of your address plus post code to the clerk. A number of local parishes are collaborating, with some support from our M.P., in compiling data which can be used as a stick with which to beat BT. A number of initiatives are afoot to expose the failure of the county broadband programme to do very much to help large numbers of households to achieve an acceptable internet speed.

Aircraft noise – have you noticed how it has increased this summer? The parish council has become a subscribing member of Gatwick Area Conservation Campaign (GACC) which is lobbying for action to change the aircraft holding (stacking) patterns now in force which have resulted in much more aircraft noise over the parish.
