Chapel News

April is going to be a busy month for us all. Easter is much later this year and this led me to find out what determines when Easter is. I discovered that Easter Sunday is determined usually by the first Sunday after a full moon occurring on or after the March equinox. (Equinox being when the sun crosses the celestial equator; when day and night are of equal length) The March equinox or Northward equinox is the equinox on the earth when the subsolar point appears to leave the Southern Hemisphere and cross the celestial equator, heading northward as seen from earth. The March equinox is known as the vernal equinox in the Northern Hemisphere and as the autumnal equinox in the Southern. The March equinox may be taken to mark the beginning of Spring!

Good Friday falls on the 19th April and the Service this year is at St. Peter's Church

It would be lovely to see you at our Easter Sunday Service 6-30 p.m when we celebrate the resurrection of Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. We will take Communion during this Service in accordance with Jesus' command to us during the Last Supper (Luke 22 v 19 & 20). The Lord Jesus on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body which is for you, do this in remembrance of me". In the same way, after supper, he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." Taking Communion reminds us that because Jesus suffered and died on the cross, and rose again from the dead on the third day (Easter Day) those who believe in Him have eternal life! What a gift!

On the 28th April we have another Healing Service. What a Blessing these have turned out to be. We have experienced the presence of The Holy Spirit at these Services and many people have received Healing. Sadly, Revd. John Maxwell who was to have led this Healing Service can no longer do so but Revd. Peter Walker has kindly offered to take his place and I am positive that Our Lord will Bless everyone who joins us on the 28th at 6-30 p.m Healing Ministry will be available to all who would like it after the Service.

Revd. Peter has been in Healing Ministry for many, many years and has seen many people Healed and also has experienced Our Lord's Healing himself.

Rev'd. Peter considers signs of Easter and Spring together with a soldier's witness and the recognition which comes from the voice and a familiar action

At Easter we use the easy example of an egg to remind us of new life. It is the simplicity of it which teaches a great truth in our celebration of new life and all that happened on that first Easter Day. An early kind of summer descended on us in February and spring was all speeded up as daffodils and other spring flowers began to show themselves in abundance. New Life undeniably!

Such new life was the issue that first Easter Day. Mary Magdalene went to the tomb to anoint the body of Jesus, as was the custom. Finding the tomb empty she wept thinking that the body of Jesus had been taken. Yet, one word dispelled her fears. 'Mary'. She knew that voice! Jesus alive again! It is this truth which drives the Christian faith; if it were not so, then Jesus would have been just another criminal nailed to the cross.

John Hogan, who served as a Combat-Infantryman, wrote to his mother shortly before he died: "I realise that anything can happen, but I know with a certainty that nothing can happen to me of which God has not foreknowledge, and has a glorious creative plan and purpose. His plan is simple. He takes us to the summit of the cross of Calvary and shows all the evil and pain and sorrow and danger in the universe, and then says: 'Fear not, for I have overcome the world.'"

Easter helps us to focus on the reality of the resurrection. If it were all untrue, Christianity would be a fraud. Yet, 2,000 years of Christian witness has everything to say about the authenticity of this way of life.

Two disciples walking along the Emmaus road encountered the risen Jesus. Walking beside them and then sharing a meal in their home and breaking the bread. Eyes were opened and there was the Lord they were mourning! Joy born out of deadness, power and love taking the place of grief. It was in very truth a miracle. It was, and is, the miracle of Easter; the cost to Jesus was the Cross.



Easter Explained

The Lent Course

Lent is the period leading up to Easter and many Christians like to use those weeks to think more deeply about their faith, to take stock of their own Christian life, and to encourage one another. The meetings take place on Tuesday mornings at 10am in the Church Hall.

Maundy Thursday

This is the day before Good Friday – the day on which Jesus died. On that day we read in John’s Gospel that Jesus sat his disciples down and washed their feet. This was an eastern custom that they would have been familiar with, but it was usually performed by a servant. Jesus told his disciples that he wanted them to live as servants – to care for each other, to wash each other’s feet and to love each other – just as he had done.

It was also the occasion when Jesus sat at supper with his disciples and asked them to remember him through the bread and wine. The bread would represent his body, broken on the cross for them. The wine would represent his blood, poured out to atone for their sins. So the church instituted this custom of holding a special service of Holy Communion, to remember that occasion and to thank God again for the sacrifice Jesus made. And in the course of the service, someone in a high position in the church will actually get down and wash the feet of a few people in the congregation. It can be a very moving moment.

Good Friday

The word “celebration” probably ought not to apply to the remembrance of someone’s excruciating death on a Roman cross, but it is because Jesus died that we can know that our sins can be forgiven. Over the years various traditions have existed in the church for “celebrating” this amazing event. Nowadays a simple service is held at 10.30am to worship God for his wonderful sacrifice, and usually the village Chapel and Ashburnham church join together for this. This year is the turn for it to be in the church.

Easter Sunday

If the crucifixion was the end of Jesus’ life and work, then there would be no church, no worldwide community of Christians, and no reason to celebrate. But the Bible teaches us that he rose again, and throughout the world, services take place on Easter Sunday, celebrating that incredible truth and worshipping God for his love, his sacrifice and his victory over death.



Book Club Recommendation

The Running Hare - The Secret Life of Farmland

by John Lewis-Stempel

This book has been praised by both Country Life and Countryfile

Edith read it first and recommended it to the rest of us.
Paula read it next and loved it so much that she had to buy her own copy.
It's beautifully written account of the creatures that live on our farmland,

Parish Council News

“For every parish there shall be a parish meeting for the purpose of discussing parish affairs . . . “, and “The parish meeting of a parish shall consist of the local government electors for the parish.” Thus spake Sections 9 and 13 respectively of the Local Government Act of 1972.

Thursday 25th April is the date this year following the usual format of an informal reception beforehand with village organisations mounting some table top display.

However, note the wording of the Act, “For every parish”. We have two parishes and each must have its own parish meeting. Naturally, they can take place consecutively at the same place and time but this year we’ll be sure to make the distinction. It’s been an oversight this past four years not to have done so but we’ll put it right this year.

This oversight came to light together with another. Penhurst never had a parish council though Ashburnham has had one since 1894. So, in 1954 a “Grouping Order” was made stating, “The parish of Penhurst shall be grouped with the neighbouring parish of Ashburnham, under a common parish council”, and “There shall continue to be a separate parish meeting for each of the parishes”, and the common parish council, . . shall be called “The Parish Council of Ashburnham with Penhurst”. No doubt the ampersand between Ashburnham and Penhurst will continue to be used widely but ‘with’ is what it should be. You can download a copy of the full grouping order from the parish council home page on the village website.

The agenda is published online at the village web site three clear days before the meeting and hard copy is put on the notice boards at The Chapel and Penhurst Granary.

“Sing like no one is listening.” The motto of the Tuneless Choir



On a recent visit to my sister, I went with her to her Tuneless Choir. Apparently a number of these have been established around the country. Tuneless Choirs are for those who love singing but lack the ability or confidence to do it in public. (See www.tunelesschoir.com.) Research has found that singing in groups brings physical, emotional and social benefits and so, in the belief that everyone has a right to sing, Tuneless Choir groups have been formed.

They sing purely for the pleasure of it – with no pressure to improve – and just aim for everyone to leave the session feeling uplifted. That was certainly the case on the evening I visited the West Bridgford choir in Nottingham. During the course of the evening they announced that they had been asked to sing at a local Christmas charity meal, at the Christmas lights switch-on, and there were also photographs of them singing in support of the runners in a recent half-marathon.

There are so few opportunities for people to sing nowadays. Maybe if you attend football matches you might get to sing, or you may sing along to the car radio. I have a pile of 60s CDs that I play in the car and join in enthusiastically on long journeys! And I remember with affection music lessons at school and learning things like the Skye Boat Song, Linden Lea and Early One Morning.

And the idea of it not mattering if you can’t sing very well is very attractive. When I sing at church there are usually enough people to cover the noise I make. When I sing at home, my very musical daughter says, “Choose a key, any key, don’t tell me which one!” So if, like me, you are not good enough for a choir, but love singing, then maybe we should start a something similar to a tuneless choir in the village...? The Ashburnham Estate – Gratitude for Surviving the Civil War

At the Restoration of the monarchy in 1660, John Ashburnham “the Cavalier” and his brother William were reinstated to their former positions as Grooms of the Bedchamber by King Charles II. Loans made to the King’s father were also repaid through grants of leases, such as one on Ampthill Park in Bedfordshire.

When they were able to return to Ashburnham they were so grateful to God for surviving the Civil War, that they set about rebuilding the Church before they undertook any work on their own home. At the East end they built a new family vault for 45 places along with the Ashburnham family Chapel of St. James containing the two monuments we can see today. William’s memorial, with its very fulsome wording to his wife, was created by renown sculptor John Bushnell.

As a further sign of their gratitude to God for His faithfulness in bringing them safely through the Civil War, John, my great grandfather with eight “greats”, donated a set of Silver Communion plate to the church on its rededication in 1665 as a “thank offering” to God. This is now on public display in the Treasury at Chichester Cathedral. John Ashburnham’s mark of the event “IA 1665” can be seen on the lintel above the two exterior doors on the new East end.

Once the church had been rededicated by the Bishop of Chichester, the brothers then embarked on rebuilding Ashburnham Place. At the same time they relocated it to its current position, from the the West Lawn where the original Tudor House sat.

Although John died in 1671 before the house could be finished, he and his brother (who had been appointed Cofferer to the Household of Charles II) had much happier times after the Civil War, not least helped by marrying well! As described on his

memorial William married the wealthy but widowed Countess of Marlborough and John’s memorial captures his two wives: Francis Holland and when she died his second Elizabeth Poulett, both from land owning families. Samuel Pepys also mentions John and William in his Diary (www.pepysdiary.com) during their latter years.

But after the extraordinary times they lived through: Royal Patronage, Civil War, Kingly master beheaded, Restoration and rebuilding, perhaps the final words about their lives should be those on William’s memorial: “The praise and glory of it be to God alone.”
