'It is well with my soul...'

These words feature in what has become a favourite hymn of mine, not least due to the incredible story behind it. The writer, Horatio Spafford (1828-1888), was a prominent and successful Chicago lawyer. He owned several properties throughout the city. He and his wife had four beautiful daughters and one son. Life was more than good – it was, in his words, "blessed!" A devout Christian, Horatio placed his trust in God, during times of both prosperity and calamity. For many years his life was joyous. Yet, faith, no matter how great, does not spare us from adversity. For Horatio, just as he hit the pinnacle of his profession and financial success, things began to change. It began with the tragic loss of his son; and not long after, the Great Chicago Fire (1871) destroyed nearly every property investment he owned.

A couple of years later, in 1873, Horatio decided to treat his wife and daughters to a much-needed escape from the turmoil. He sent them on a boat trip to Europe, with plans to join them shortly after wrapping up some business in Chicago. However, a few days later, he received a dreadful telegram from his wife, "Saved alone..." It bore the excruciating news that the steamship, Ville de Havre, had been struck by an iron vessel killing 226 passenger, including Horatio's 4 daughters.

It was while Horatio was on his way to meet his heartbroken wife, passing over the same spot that had just claimed the lives of his remaining children, that he put pen to paper and the timeless hymn ('It is well with my soul') was born, beginning with the words:

When peace like a river, attendeth my way, When sorrows like sea billows roll; Whatever my lot, Thou hast taught me to say, It is well, it is well, with my soul.

If you've got access to the internet, check out the words of this beautiful hymn – I find it humbling, comforting and inspiring. To think such encouraging and uplifting words were born from the depths of such unimaginable sorrow – incredible. Yet, it is often at such times, when confronted with one's mortality and human frailty, that we can discover something of the depth of God's love, presence, and peace in the midst of life's storms.

This is reflected in many of the Psalms we find in the Bible. The Psalmist, with real honesty, tells God about life as it is for him – which is often tough! For example, Psalm 16 acknowledges personal struggle and life's trouble, but the writer also exemplifies a deep trust in God in both life and death, expressed so firmly in five simple but powerful words: "I have set the Lord always before me. Because the Lord is at my right hand I shall not be shaken".

The secret of the Psalmist's confidence, along with that of Horatio Spafford centuries later, is his trust in GOD. At the beginning he prays that God will be his keeper and his guardian: "Keep me safe...", but it's a prayer that is based on a commitment of trust, "...in you I take refuge". The Psalmist found his shelter and security in God; he also submitted to God as his Master: "You are my Lord, apart from you I have no good thing".


Now it could be argued the world of the Psalmist (and Horatio Spafford) was very different to our own and conclude that such hope and confidence is 'unrealistic' in our contemporary world. As wars persist, racial tensions fester, addictions of various sorts thrive, many struggle with broken and fragile relationships, and illness encroaches, the 'feel good factor' expressed by the Psalmist can seem like wishful thinking. However, the psalmist lived in a world that was equally violent, equally uncertain, and equally threatening, as our own. Yet amid all the pressures of life and the threats he faced he declared, "I will not be shaken". Friends, it is the same God who invites us to trust Him, and who promises to be a 'refuge and strength, an ever-present help in time of trouble' to all who seek Him.





Parish Council News

Oh dear. The best laid plans of mice and men . . . After several years of managing our verges in collaboration with the County Council Highways team, involving them in holding off cutting the verges until after the flower seeds have dropped in the autumn, along comes the Highways drainage team who clean out the ditches and carefully place the spoil on the flowering verges. Paul Spicer, who takes the lead for the Parish Council on verges maintenance, could only intervene after the damage was done.



The best we can do now, and Paul is on the case, is to investigate how it is that the drainage team are not in the Highways communication loop regarding maintenance of verges in an environmentally friendly way. It is not just the encouragement of wild flowers, but of wild life development, which is at stake. This is why we moved from a position of holding off cutting just three wild flower designated verges to one of holding off cutting everywhere so as to encourage wild life too.

The ditches are cleared on a four year cycle so it will be 2027 before the drainage team comes back again. By then we will hopefully be able to find a time slot in the year which does not interfere with the flowering verges. Coincidentally, in the week that the ditches were being cleared the Parish Council had its 6-monthly meeting with Highways and we were given to understand that ditch clearing in the summer was a deliberate policy as it is easier to carry out the work effectively when the ground is dry. This suggests that it is a seasonal activity rather than being all year round which should mean that there is scope to negotiate a better time for the work.



Tupperware reps, I discovered, employed a technique called 'carrot calling' to promote parties: they would travel door-to-door to ask housewives to 'run an experiment' to compare Tupperware stored carrots with those stored in the usual way. Party bookings mushroomed.

I was invited to a product party in April. Our winter-ravaged faces were first soothed by warm cloths and we followed this by massaging lotions, rich in essential oils, into our skin. Back home after several hours of pampering I slept like a toddler after a triple swim session. The next morning, bright and breezy, as I set off for Bexhill I caught sight of myself in the driver's mirror; I was stunned by the transformation. I glowed! Unfortunately, just a few miles on (half-way down Sidley High Street to be exact) my luminous radiance - and smugness - faded rapidly as heavy clouds passed over the sun. The miracle of transformation was just a mirage of transportation... the sun shining into the car and reflecting off my bright yellow jumper! Writing in late May we have been blessed with a long-awaited run of sublime weather. The hedgerows are cloaked in the delicate, white sprays of cowparsley and black-thorn (also known as 'May') and the meadows are so high and dense with buttercups that the pollen has tinted my trainers yellow. I could easily wander off through the fields to lie down, invisible in my bright yellow jumper, only to be discovered days later, fast asleep in a state of early summer bliss.

Sunny days and fields of flowers are indeed food for the soul and can promote a sense of well-being, but it's sometimes easy to forget, amidst the pace and responsibilities of life, that the state of bliss is always with us - not just when the sun is shining. This presence is a constant state - and right there if we make a little time and space to access it, even if only for a few moments. Putting aside our daily distractions and mind chatter, being empty of the things that don't serve us at that time and tapping into the 'golden yolk' at our centre is more than food for the soul - it's a party!

Garden and Nature Notes

I'm writing this just after the wonderful rain we had in mid June, it may have upset some plans I had but I couldn't have been happier about it! After no rain for about a month I'm sure your gardens were as dry and plants suffering as much as mine. It feels that we're experiencing changes to our climate and seasonal weather that will affect how we garden. I am finding that planting in late spring is becoming less attractive as we are more frequently faced with hot, dry weather at about this time. However it can also be a challenge planting in autumn when faced with very wet and cold winters as we have experienced recently. As gardeners and growers we know we have to be adaptable as we deal with different conditions, pests, diseases and so on each year. We can learn from each other and from observing what does well in our gardens and those around us.

Nature can struggle to adapt too, the cold weather we had in early spring followed by the lack of rain has meant fewer insects around and available which impacts nesting birds trying to feed hungry broods and people are reporting finding dead chicks which haven't fed enough to thrive.

This year, at Ashburnham Place, we have been delighting in the roses which seem to be more floriferous than ever this year and certainly paying back the effort of pruning in the cold winter months (done by my fantastic volunteers and trainee this year while I was away!) Biennials have also been having a glorious season, these plants which are sown about now, put on leafy growth in the first year and then flower the next spring or summer and include Sweet William, Wallflowers, Honesty and Foxgloves. They are worth the effort to get seeds going in June or July as they fill the garden with colour and interest and frequently self seed in future years. They are often good cut flowers too. I love plants that self seed and am enjoying drifts of Cornflowers, Corncockle, Love in a Mist and Ammi majus. These annuals (meaning that they germinate, grow and flower in the same year) are also good value in the garden, often just getting on with the whole process of growing and flowering with very little input from me! I have gradually moved from using more traditional bedding plants such as Pelargonium, Busy Lizzie and Begonia which are quite labour and resource intensive to annuals that are easier to grow from seed and which self seed over time, the result is a more naturalistic, cottage garden feel which requires less work over time. It can be a bit hit and miss, some years there are gaps but growing a few annuals such as Cosmos and Clary Sage means we have reserves to pop in to bring colour and interest. Jay Ashworth
