Our Faithful Queen – a Life of Faith and Service.

The Platinum Jubilee provides us with a great opportunity to come together to celebrate HM The Queen's faithful service to our country and commonwealth. 'Service' has been the hallmark of her remarkable 70-year reign. In her 21st birthday address Princess Elizabeth, as she was then, asked for her people's support and God's help: "I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service... God help me to make good my vow, and God bless all of you who are willing to share in it." She reiterated this pledge and plea following the death of her father, King George VI, on 6 February 1952.

It was the following year, on 2 June 1953, that the Queen was crowned at Westminster Abbey in a deeply symbolic service devised in AD 973. The orb, sceptre, ring and crown used in the ceremony each include a cross to symbolise the rule of Jesus Christ over the earth. However, though the crown jewels are set with many of the world's most valuable gems, it was something else presented during the coronation which was described as 'the most valuable thing this world affords'. It was a Bible, presented to the Queen by the Archbishop of Canterbury with these words: "Our gracious Queen, to keep your Majesty ever mindful of the Law and the Gospel of God as the Rule for the whole life and government of Christian Princes, we present you with this book, the most valuable thing this world affords." Now to say the Bible is the most valuable thing in the world is quite a claim! Would you regard the Bible as your most valuable possession? There are those who would reject this claim outright; while some would say other things are just as valuable. However, the claim is based more upon what the Bible is and what it says rather than its financial worth. The Bible is God's Book and is the main way in which we get to know who God is. Christians believe it is not manufactured by human beings but by those who were inspired by God. This makes the Bible unique and during her coronation the Queen, with her hand on an open Bible, promised to "maintain the Laws of God", "the true profession of the Gospel" and "the Protestant Reformed Religion established by law".


However, perhaps the most sacred moment at the heart of the coronation ceremony is the anointing when the symbols of royal status are removed. The Queen, sitting under a canopy to hide the sacred moment from the cameras, was dressed in a simple white dress with no jewels or crown. As the Archbishop anointed her with oil, the prayers said over her invited God's Holy Spirit to set her apart as God's servant. Christians believe that God's anointing fills His people with His love and empowers them to follow Him. Interestingly, the extended Platinum Jubilee bank holiday weekend (2-5 June) includes Pentecost Sunday (sometimes known as 'Whit Sunday'), when Christians celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit, following the death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus (which I wrote about in last month's Parish Magazine).


Underpinning her life has been the Queen's deep, personal Christian faith, which she spoke about openly at the end of her Christmas broadcast in 2000, when she said: "For me the teachings of Christ and my own personal accountability before God provide a framework in which I try to lead my life. I, like so many of you, have drawn great comfort in difficult times from Christ's words and example." And more recently, in her 2016 Christmas broadcast, the Queen said of Jesus Christ: "(He) lived obscurely for most of his life, and never travelled far. He was maligned and rejected by many, though He had done no wrong. And yet, billions of people now follow His teaching and find in Him the guiding light for their lives. I am one of them because Christ's example helps me see the value of doing small things with great love, whoever does them and whatever they themselves believe".

HM The Queen has seen and experienced much change in her 96 years. Like all of us, she has encountered life's 'ups and downs' – both as a wife, mother and monarch. However, the pledge and plea for prayer she sought as a 21-year-old, and following the death of her father, has been answered. Her life of faith and service is inspirational and worth celebrating and, as a village, we have an opportunity to do so, thanks to the Parish Council and those involved in the events happening locally to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee Weekend. It'll be great fun and an opportunity to come together as a community, to celebrate the life, faith, and service our faithful Queen, who is both an inspiration and example to us all.

We are keen to understand what wildflowers and other wildlife we have in the churchyard. We have set moth traps there already (see the Nature Notes column for more details)

Caring for God's Acre organise a week called 'Love Your Burial Ground' and have Churches Count on Nature events where people are encouraged to record the species they find in their churchyards.

We are planning two sessions:

Friday 3rd, 3pm - 4pm and after church on Sunday 12th in Ashburnham Churchyard where we will identify the wild flowers we find. More details on facebook and the church and village websites.

Parish Council News

Potholes and verges were at the top of the agenda when the Parish Council met East Sussex Highways recently. The meetings are held every six months and the meetings scheme is called 'Strengthening Local Relationships' (SLR). Readers may recall that nearly a year ago, Parish Councillor Ron King grouped the list of outstanding road repairs to five key areas where pothole filling was clearly insufficient and something more radical was needed. The Parish Council presented the list to Highways just before the November 2021 SLR meeting giving them sufficient notice to look at them before the meeting which they duly did.



As a direct result, a number of problem areas on the list have had attention. The T-junction of Brownbread Street at Ponds Green has been patched and the mobile jet patcher has worked its way along Forge Lane from The Chapel to Penhurst.

Farthing Lane was one of the list of five and was scheduled for patching a few days before the last SLR meeting at the beginning of May. However, the one modest patch did not come close to meeting our expectations. What the Parish Council learned in the ensuing discussion is that the funding for road repairs has a third arm in addition to the normal two. The normal two are the annual roads maintenance budget which funds the contract with Costain-CH2M and the annual works programme decided a year in advance and covering major projects.

Currently there is a third fund - a central government direct grant to County Councils for road repairs. As a result, East Sussex Highways have additional funds for 'patching' which means patching up to seven multiple sections of road each being no more than 50 sq metres. The Highways Stewards have each been tasked with generating 8 schemes a week in the area they cover and the Parish Council lobbied our steward at the SLR meeting to make sure we get our fair share of schemes.

There is more positive and welcome news on the subject of verges. For the second year running we have three designated areas of verge, particularly abundant in wild flowers, which will not be cut until the autumn when the seed heads have dried and seeds dispersed. Now there is an additional environmental protection scheme being piloted this year. Called Wildlife Corridors, we have volunteered to be part of the pilot. In a nutshell it means that no verges in the parishes will be cut until August at the earliest unless there is a safety issue with visibility. Therefore, between the Wild Flower Verges and the Wildlife Corridors we can look forward to our verges remaining uncut until later in the year when the flowers are past their peak.

The agenda is published online at the village web site three clear days before the meeting and hard copy is put on the notice board at The Chapel.



Nature Notes

I had a fantastic day in May, assisting a moth expert, Dr Andrew Crowson, as he set light traps overnight in three different sites in Ashburnham Place, an open area surrounded by woodland, the churchyard and the prayer garden. Lots of different moths were trapped and safely released after identification. It was amazing to see the variety, size and colour of the moths we found. There were several Poplar Hawk-moths, which have a wingspan up to 9cm and look like they'r made of camouflage fabric. We also found some Buff-tip moths, which resemble a broken twig - I encourage to look both of these up online and check out some photographs. The website of Butterfly Conservation has a lot of great resources, www.butterfly-conservation.org

We also went out with nets during the day to carefully catch day flying moths to record and identify before releasing. We found the colourful Speckled Yellow which is almost orange with large dark blotches and the female Muslin moth which is pure white with tiny black dots over the body and wings.

Moths play an vital role in our gardens, they and their caterpillars are a food source for many of our birds - especially important at the moment as the young are being fed. Moths are also pollinators and even night flying moths have an important role to play, often visiting large numbers of flowers and transporting pollen as they go. There has been a sharp decline in moth numbers since the 1970s which is of great concern and has a knock on effect on other species.

I led the Village Walk in May and a small group of us wandered along the Ashbourne and then around the Pound and down the track looking at the different wildflowers and trees we could see. Taking time to walk slowly, crouch down and really look at what was growing under our feet proved to be a really enjoyable experience. As the Bluebells and Garlic have gone over, the Cow Parsley has taken over in the lanes. We can also find Ajuga reptans with its tall spikes of blue flowers, these are great ground cover plants and several varieties are available to gardeners some with dark purple, almost black leaves others with vibrant pinky/purple variegation. They useful in shady spots in the garden. Early Purple Orchids have finished now but Common Spotted Orchids are coming up - they also have spotted leaves but a paler pink flower spike.

Many of you know I love taking photographs of the landscapes, wild flowers and wildlife here. If you go to the Penhurst Open Day on June 11th (See ad later in the magazine) you will be able to see an exhibition of my photographs which will also be available for sale, raising money for the Retreat Centre.

Chapel News

We are looking forward to all the celebrations organised in the village this month for the Queens 70th year on the throne. Culminating with an Anniversary Songs of Praise at the Chapel. We do hope you will come and join us.

The 5th June is also Pentecost Sunday when we remember that the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles and all the believers with the sound of a violent wind and with tongues of fire. What a terrifying and wonderful sight that must have been. Can you just imagine it? I do not have a very vivid imagination but even I, can see the tongues of fire flashing through the air and landing on the Apostles and believers and them all starting to speak in all different languages (we know this now as 'Speaking in Tongues'.) There were lots of people from all different cities there and when they heard the Apostles speaking in their own languages they were amazed and wondered what was going on.

The crowd accused the Apostles of being drunk, but it was only 9 a.m in the morning so pretty unlikely. Then Peter filled with the Holy Spirit explained to the crowd that this was what the prophet Joel had foretold, "And afterwards, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy;; your old men will dream dreams, your young men will see visions. Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy (Joel 2 v 28 – 29)

Peter then went on to explain who Jesus was and what had happened to him, "Listen to these words, fellow Israelites! Jesus of Nazareth was a man whose divine authority was clearly proven to you by all the miracles and wonders which God performed through him. You yourselves know this, for it happened here among you. In accordance with his own plan God had already decided that Jesus would be handed over to you; and you killed him by letting sinful men crucify him. But God raised him from death, setting him free from its power, because it was impossible that death should hold him prisoner. (Acts 2 v 22 – 24)

These words from Peter who only a few weeks earlier had been so timid that he denied knowing Jesus three times. Now filled with the Holy Spirit he was a different man, bold and brave!

In Acts 1 v 8 Jesus had told the disciples that they would receive power when the Holy Spirit came upon them and that they would be his witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. And now they were seeing it happen before their eyes. After Peter's speech 3000 became believers! The rest of the book of Acts tell how after the Day of Pentecost the disciples were bold and courageous and did all the things that Jesus had done. And the story is still going on. The Holy Spirit is still filling believers so that they can be witnesses to those around them and do all the things that Jesus told them to do.
