An Easter Celebrity!

We increasingly live in a 'celebrity culture': everyone wants their fifteen minutes of fame; notability or even notoriety will do. Social media, magazines, newspapers, and television game shows 'ooze' celebrity. A celebrity culture is very enticing and the public acclamation we afford to others is very revealing. It says something about what we value - image, money, recognition, youth, power. More than that, it says something about human identity, about who we think we are, and who we would like to be.

The word 'celebrity' comes from the Latin root, 'celebrem' which has connotations with both 'fame' and 'being thronged'. And if you read the gospel accounts of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on the day we have come to know as Palm Sunday, you might easily imagine that Jesus was a sort of first century celebrity: "The next day the great crowd that had come for the Feast heard that Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem. They took palm branches and went out to meet him, shouting, 'Hosanna!' 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!' 'Blessed is the King of Israel!'." The 'Feast' was the Passover when over 2 million people gathered in Jerusalem and this great crowd, fuelled by reports of the raising of Lazarus, heard Jesus was coming and so they acclaimed Him as their King, the one who would lead the rebellion against the Roman occupation of their land. Consequently, the crowd were full of nationalistic and messianic fervour. However, He came not on a warhorse but on a donkey; to defeat not the Romans but the power of sin and death. This was to fulfil what had been foretold hundreds of years earlier by a prophet called Zechariah: "Do not be afraid, O daughter of Zion; see, your king is coming seated on a donkey's colt."; a King who would proclaim peace to the nations and whose rule will extend to the ends of the earth. Thus, Jesus' triumphal entry showed that His Kingship was non-military. He would be crowned upon a cross of sacrifice through which He will achieve freedom for His worldwide subjects who put their faith in Him. He is the King of peace through whom we can have peace with God, but to achieve this He needed to ride on in lowly pomp to die. I sometimes wonder how many of those who cried 'Hosanna' on Palm Sunday cried, 'Crucify' on Good Friday?

You see, Jesus knew He was about to die, despite the acclamation He received. He knew that the crowd would soon be shouting 'crucify him!'. However, Jesus' death was not to be a tragedy, but rather a triumph. For by going the way of the cross, by His supreme act of obedience unto death, He first had to endure the suffering before the glory, the cross before the crown, and all that that entailed – the pain, the humiliation, the false accusation, the agony, and the burden of bearing the sins of the whole world. He endured all of this for you and for me - He perished so that we don't have to - hence, the day we remember His death is GOOD FRIDAY and why Jesus is GOOD NEWS for sharing.

So let us celebrate His victorious resurrection and all that it means to be ransomed, healed, restored, and forgiven!

Friends, Easter is the greatest ever story of hope! Despite what is going on in the world, and perhaps in our own lives right now, the message of triumph of life over death, light over darkness, love over hatred, peace over anxiety, and joy over grief remains unchanged.

Lent 2024: A Journey Through Lent



Lent provides an opportunity to reflect and to 'take stock' of our lives in relation to God. The 40 days represent the time Jesus Himself spent fasting and praying in the wilderness before He began His public ministry. This year a five-week Lent Course is being held in the Church Hall (within the walled garden at

Ashburnham Place, access by car via Kitchenham Road only). These informal meetings will take place on Thursday evenings during Lent, between 7.30 pm and 9 pm. With a mix of Bible study and discussion the course will explore contemporary issues and be encouraged to act on what we learn about six people's encounters with Jesus, as recorded in the New Testament. The course will also help us understand the significance of this season and to reflect on our own life journey, not least in relation to the death and resurrection of Jesus which we commemorate and celebrate at Easter. 

Revd Gary's Ramble around the Benefice!



Parish Council News

At its January meeting the Parish Council is required to set the element of Council Tax which comes as the Council's income for the year, what is known as the Parish Precept. There is some good news this year as despite inflation running higher than we have been used to for many years the increase in the precept has been kept to 2.81%. This has been made possible because this year there are a few less people eligible for relief from paying council tax so there are more people contributing to the sum requested by the Parish Council. In fact an increase of 2.81% paid by households equates to an increase of 6.23% in the sum received by the Council which, for 2024/25, is £14,500.



There is more good news when it comes to hire charges for the pavilion. The council decided not to increase them in line with inflation as that would have meant an increase of 3%. Instead they decided to hold them where they are for another year until March 2025. Hire charges at the village hall will follow suit.



As we go to press we have learned that Nicci Gagel is leaving the parish council and leaving the district. Nicci is heading for Aberdeen to look after her elderly parents. Nicci was co-opted to the Parish Council in May 2022 and soon found an issue she made her own. Rather than using the old phone box at The Pound as a museum of village history she had the idea of using it as a platform for publicising forthcoming village

events. Who can forget her decoration for the coronation? The gap she leaves on the Council can be filled by co-option so if anyone is interested in knowing more about what is involved in being a parish councillor then do contact the Clerk.



As I write this in early February I thought I'd look at my photo roll from last March. As I scroll down I find a field walk showing close-ups of dangly hazel catkins, their name derived from the Dutch *katteken*, meaning kitten, as they resemble kitten tails – we also know them as lambs' tails; each male catkin comprises 240 flowers. Next come a few frames of glossy, wild garlic spears which I can actually taste as I write; by coincidence this morning I spotted the first little patch of tiny, fresh leaves and had a nibble. And now there are several pictures of a gorse bush, its yolky-yellow, bonnet-like flowers glowing in the sun.

Moving on, by contrast, I'm in Sir John Soane's Museum, London - he was an architect and collector. The photos remind me that he might have won a supermarket sweep of the world's classic, and more recent, antiquities and then stacked, squeezed and suspended the entire booty throughout two elegant town houses. Unique, eclectic, beautiful. (But I imagine his wife might have suggested a garage sale on more than one occasion!) The visit is free and there's a rail sale until 15 March.

My photos now take me back to a field, a sprig of pale lichen floating in brackish spring water is recreated by the reflection of bare oak branches above. And then ten pictures of the sky, blue with streaks of straight white clouds - whatever happened to those big, billowing clouds of the 70's? Blinkand-you-miss-it blue seems to be the shade of the season. By the tenth photo the sky is completely white.

Ah (I smile) the next picture shows a café table with a big 'J' made out of dominoes after a game with my special little friend Jack. Quality time. And following on, another coincidence, the final photo is a poster I saw for a local chess club. I finally went today! I didn't play the 12 year old UK champion but I kept my chin up... just.
