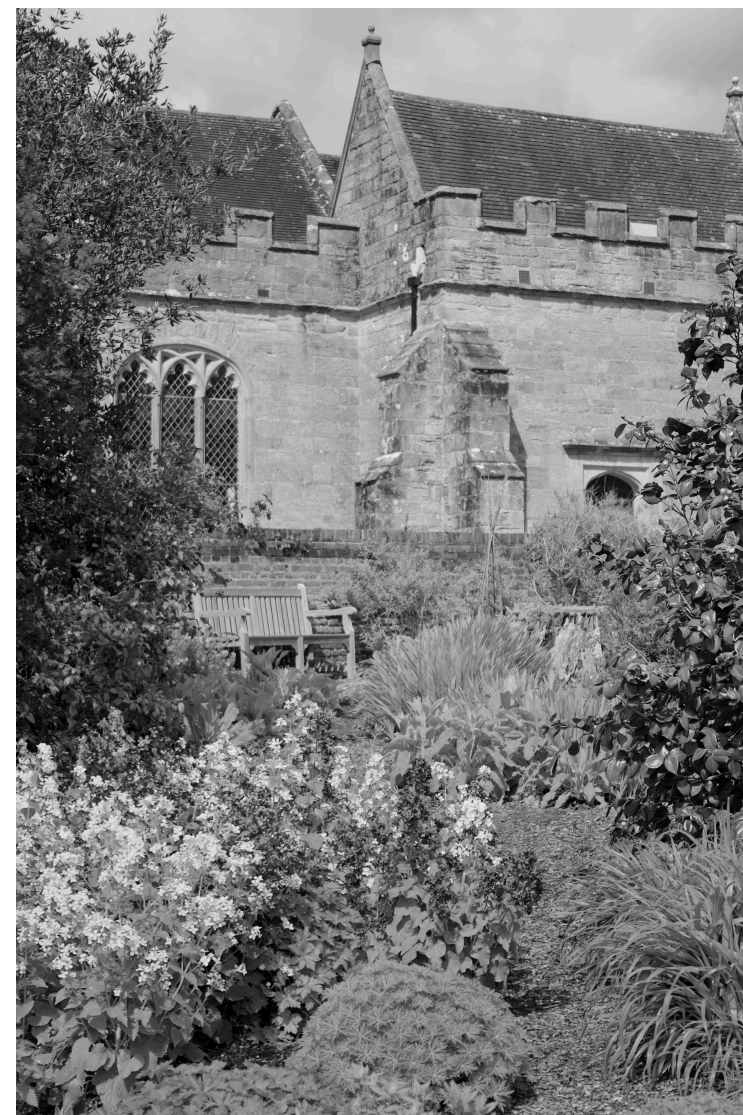

Les Miserables is one of the most popular musicals of all time and is probably my favourite. Though originally written over 160 years ago, the story continues to capture hearts and imaginations today. The two characters at the centre of Victor Hugo's novel are the policeman Javert (played by Russell Crowe in the film version) and the convict Jean Valjean (Hugh Jackman). Javert is a man of the law, zealous in his commitment to it and enslaved by the fear of wrongdoing. Valjean, the man outside the law, is reborn into a life of compassion and love through the freedom brought by forgiveness. Having stolen some silver from a bishop who had shown him compassion, Javert tries to take him back to prison, but the bishop intervenes, claiming to have given Valjean the silver as a gift. The ex-convict is astonished: but the bishop knows what he's doing. 'Now remember this, my brother,' he sings. 'See in this some higher plan.' The bishop wants Valjean to see a divine hand in the unexpected act of mercy, and to be transformed by it.

Valjean's world is changed forever by this act of grace, he casts off his old identity, and commits himself to a life of mercy and service. Rising to become the town mayor, he encounters Fantine (Anne Hathaway), a single mother forced into prostitution, and agrees to adopt her daughter Cosette who is effectively a slave to the cruel Thénadiers, until Valjean comes along. Through a chain of events which seems set in motion by divine intervention, we see Cosette lifted out of poverty and into a new life where she is loved and cherished.

Despite the passing years Valjean realises that Javert is still intent on hunting him down and the startling contrast between these two men reveals the heart of the story. The policeman thinks that because he's upheld the law, he has God on his side. But the ex-convict begins at rock-bottom, knowing that he doesn't deserve anything from God. He is certainly imperfect, but he discovers that God loves and cares for him despite his crimes. In contrasting their journeys, the story becomes a parable about our different reactions to God's mercy and grace.

In one of His own parables, Jesus talked about two sons: a younger brother who wasted his father's money before returning destitute and humbled, and an older brother who believed he'd lived well enough to earn his father's favour. To the surprise of His original hearers, Jesus suggested that the younger son was in a far better position. *Les Misérables* echoes His message, and this, perhaps, is the key to its popularity and power. We all love a good story– but more than anything, whether we acknowledge it or not, there is in all of us an innate hunger for acceptance, forgiveness, and mercy – which lies at the heart of God's Good News for all of us.

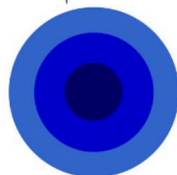

Parish Council news –

In May 2015, on the same day as the General Election, a referendum was held in the village to test support for a new village hall. The polling station was a cattle trailer parked in the gateway of a field round the corner from the village hall. The turnout was about 85% and the support for a new hall was also about 85%. There was support for borrowing £200k on the basis that it cost the average household £3.50 per month. Soon after the result of the vote was known Ashburnham Thanksgiving Trust pledged to donate £100k if the rest of the money could be raised. At a guessed total cost of not much more than £400k the project looked doable. The parish council got behind the project and spent about £15,000, most of it in the initial years during which a team of fund raisers also got into their stride eventually raising some £31,000. The parish council net expenditure dropped to £5,600. Battling stiff head winds the team achieved planning permission in 2017 and managed to just beat the three year deadline for making a start by getting one foundation support in the ground and signed off. However, one head wind has proved unbeatable thus far and that is the rising costs. A guess of £400k in 2015 may not have been wide of the mark. Since then we have had the Covid pandemic and rampant inflation. By March 2023 a firm price of £515k had been established for just the construction of a water tight shell, but fitting it out could cost half as much again. In 2015 the funds of which we could be certain would have covered three quarters of the cost, but now those same funds won't even cover half of it. The fund raising team has reluctantly advised the parish council that there is little prospect of raising the money to cover the difference and the fact that we already have a village hall makes it even harder to win grants. The team proposes putting the project on hold for a few years and investing the remaining sums raised until a firm winding up decision is made. During the period when support for a new village hall was at its height, support for the existing village hall was neglected. Happily, that is now changing rapidly and next month we can no doubt report on what shape that is taking.

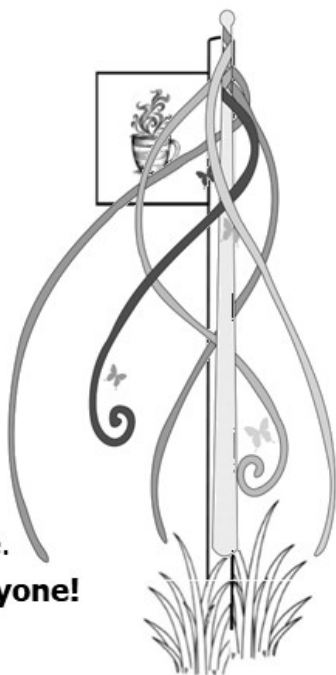

Murmurations

I climb the steps between two tall, fluted ionic columns framing a giant portal set in a sand-stone building. Its celestial-blue painted doors are huge and flung open. Inside... books, books, books... lining walls of oak shelves which rise high above my head and accessed by those lovely sliding wooden library ladders.

Novels are scattered and stacked on carved oak tables; cairn-like towers of tomes grow from wood floors; deep Chesterfield sofas invite perusal before purchase. Not musty or fusty or dusty. As the sunlight pours in through the circular lantern in the high ceiling, peacock-bright paperbacks and high-brow hardbacks jostle for space in a kaleidoscope of colour. The city of Bath's Topping & Company's bookshop and café is thriving!

Books put themselves in my way and, as I pass reinterpreted phone boxes, doorsteps, church nooks and swap boxes the right ones appear just at the right time. I currently have about 15 books making up my bedside 'book cairn' – they're challenging, fascinating, thought-provoking, eye-opening, intriguing, revealing, questioning, and entertaining. Reference books – I like them to be intelligent and well sourced, fiction must be inspiring and deeply researched, memoirs – honest and grounded.

Books are indispensable: many years ago, living in Hove as a newly qualified teacher, I accidentally nudged a little white car early one morning as I pulled out of my parking space. Alone, the little white car trundled slowly and backwards down the road. A friend who left his flat for work found me draped over the boot and chrome bumper of Little Car to stop it being crushed in the busy bus lane. Together, we pushed it back to its space and left it secure with his two Brighton and Hove telephone directories wedged under its little back wheels. And a note – the handbrake was off.

The right books at the right time - like sliding doors - can draw people together, sparking connections, discussions, laughter; they can even lead to love – and they can literally be life savers. Books can be both cerebrally illuminating and holistically healing - bringing light into our minds and spirits and lightness into our physical body. And books can empower us. Ninety-five percent of our health is really in our own hands. On the top of my pile right now is A Pukka Life by Sebastian Pole (of Pukka teas), it's beautiful and informative, a holistic approach that addresses the needs of all the systems of the body. I don't remember where I acquired it but I know this... it's a gift.

Retreat!

We are fortunate to have a wonderful retreat here in Ashburnham just a short walk or car-ride away, but I have been fortunate to have a week away in another retreat in Portugal. OK, a bit further away and involves a plane-ride but what an amazing experience! The retreat is called Monte Sahaja and is in the mountains of southern Portugal. No, not those kind of mountains with snow; they are like big hills with vegetation consisting of cork, olive and eucalyptus trees. In just a few years they have amassed a haven of every conceivable plant you might think of including 2,000-year-old olive, massive-girth trees, trucked in from the Algarve. Yes, even though they have several meters circumference, they can be uprooted and replanted using heavy machinery and continue to grow.

Some of you may remember my son, Reuben? Yes, he went to Dallington Primary and Claverham. Well, Rumi, as he is now called, has lived in Sahaja for nearly eight years; the first couple of years in a tent, very cold at night in winter, but now living in a small cabin about 8 foot square with just a bed and a hand-made wardrobe for his clothes. There are about a hundred helpers in the retreat all allotted to teams to make the whole thing tick. There are about 8 in each team and Rumi oversees and coordinates the teams as well as being involved with security for the approximate 50-acre hilly site. These days we rarely hear of a "wise man" but that is what I would describe the leader of this vast family. He is Mooji, an artist who taught art in Brixham many years ago. With just 5 followers he developed the retreat, constructed flat areas, built many structures including cafes, prayer centres, bore holes for water, many toilet blocks, resident cabins and all without planning permission! Well, you can get away with it there as it is remote, but beautiful. The planning officer was invited to see the complex and had nothing but praise for the beauty of the place. It even has its own fire engine and team that help out when there are local wild fires and Rumi is one of the fireman. There is an Indian theme but all faiths are welcome; indeed visitors and helpers come from all over the world bring their willingness to help even though they may have special talents. Such people are often orchestral standard musicians so Sahaja has made its own music including singers and choirs. They have purchased a large building in the local village where another team have set up a large café/restaurant; Mooji and Sahara are highly respected by the local community and on Sundays they have visitors numbering in the hundreds. I could go on, there is so much to tell and the only way to appreciate this amazing sanctuary is to stay there for a while; a treat at the retreat!

Gardening and Nature Notes

Our familiar and welcome migrating birds are gradually returning from their epic journeys, Chiff Chaffs, Swallows and Reed Warblers have been seen and heard as they settle back in to life in Sussex. I was able to see a slightly more exotic visitor, one of the two Hoopoes that were spotted in Hankham, near

Pevensey. They are glamorous looking birds and it was great to see one feeding in the field. Nesting is already well under way for our native birds too, we have Starlings and Blackbirds clearly feeding young as they go to and from their nests with beak-fulls of worms and other insects.

I often use BirdNet, an app on my phone to help id birdsong and am gradually learning more songs with its assistance. There are other apps too, Merlin is also well thought of. They are a great way to help you id in the field or you can save observations and check them out later if you haven't got reception.

The weather continues to be a challenge to gardeners and farmers alike with lots of wet weather and some colder nights as well but the Bluebells, Wild Garlic and Early Purple Orchids seem to be happy with the conditions and are putting on wonderful shows around the lanes and woodlands. The wide verge on Forge Lane has well over a hundred Early Purple Orchids flowering this year, looking absolutely stunning.

I am starting with a new vegetable bed this year at home due to some changes in the garden so I am trying to add plenty of leaf mould, compost and well rotted manure to get things off to a good start and give the plants the nutrition they need to crop well throughout the season. Not everyone has room for a separate vegetable plot and at Ashburnham Place we're slotting a few fruit and veg plants into the ornamental gardens to show how they can blend in well with other flowers in the borders. We have planted some rhubarb already and are planning to add some Rainbow Chard plants with their colourful stems.

I hope you have a copy of the Flower Show Schedule with this magazine. You can download a copy from the Parish Website if not www.ashburnham-penhurst.net. Do check out the classes, there are lots of ways to show off your vegetable, fruit and flower growing abilities. Please do have a think about entering, it's great fun and you might even win a cup for your carefully tended produce! Watch out in next month's magazine for some show entering tips to help you succeed!
