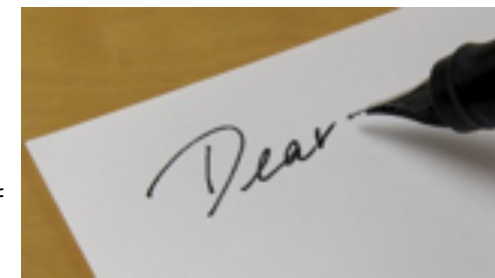

*Peter considers letter writing and how the
Early Church was built up by the New
Testament letters*



When did you last write a letter?
I cannot remember when I did. In the age of
email, texts, and other smart devices, letter
writing has rather taken a back seat.
There is though, still something quite exciting about receiving a hand-written letter.
The peculiar thrill of seeing your name on the front of an envelope, and anticipating
what unknown words inside is something special. The joy too of sitting down to
write a letter. When did you last pour out your thoughts, feelings, or emotions
through pen on paper?

I recall well how in my primary school, we were taught handwriting with an italic
pen. As one became proficient in such writing the words looked truly artistic.
The advent of the ballpoint pen rather sent my handwriting downhill.
Letter writing can be seen as a gift because someone has taken his/her time
to write and think and express love.

In the New Testament we have twenty-one letters written to the early church,
mostly by Saint Paul. In these letters Paul does several things. He exhorts
the new Christians to live lives which display Jesus. He also wrote to put the
early Christians straight on their thinking. Finally, he wrote to encourage the
fledgling churches as they faced the many challenges of that period.

The Bible has once been described as 'A love letter from God', and what a
wonderful communication this truly is!

Gardening and Nature Notes

I have been thinking about writing something for the magazine for a while now and wondered whether to do a gardening column but thought that I might expand the subject a bit to include observations about the natural world too. We're very fortunate to live in this little patch of East Sussex and there is so much beauty around us that it's good to take a moment to stop and really notice all that is going on around us!

If you are thinking of entering the Flower Show this year then have a good look through the schedule to see what classes you are interested in. There is still time to get some seeds in and growing in time., particularly annuals which are not hardy and can only be sown or planted out after all risk of frost has passed.

Read the instructions in the schedule carefully, there are details about how many items you need and whether everything in the floristry classes needs to be home grown for example. If you are considering entering the cut flower classes, consider what you have growing in your garden already and what you annuals you could add. Remember to check regularly for pests and diseases and protect tender young plants from slug or rabbit attack if needed so you have beautiful specimens by show time.

Spring is a wonderful time of year to be out and about around our villages. The cuckoo flower or lady's smock, *Cardamine pratensis* has mostly finished flowering now and will be replaced by the common spotted orchid, *Dactylorhiza fuchsia* on the roadside verges. The bluebells, *Hyacinthoides non-scripta* are also flowering in the woodlands around and about, it's well worth going for a walk to seek them out and marvel at the carpet of blue underneath the trees.

Many of our migrant birds are back already, we spotted the first swallows at Ashburnham Place in early April and Chiff Chaffs have been singing away in the woods for some weeks now. Listen out for the Turtle Dove around the village from this month onwards too. These pretty birds are becoming increasingly rare and are red listed in England. They return from their winter homes in the middle east and north africa in late April or early May and last year we had confirmed sightings of them in Ashburnham Village and at Ashburnham Place. Listen out for their distinctive purring call. If you are interested in how to improve habits to encourage them to breed here, check out this website which has lots of useful information, www.operationturtledove.org

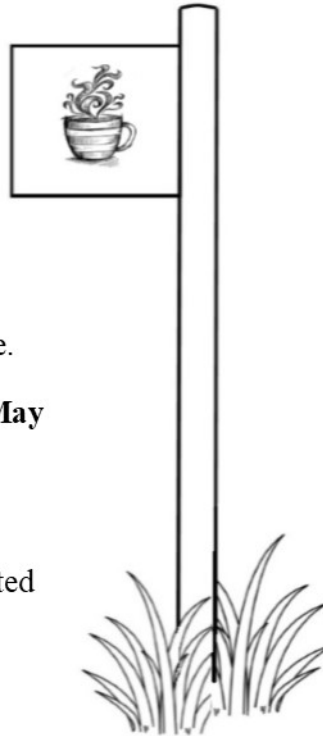

Elderflower Cordial Recipe

Elder trees will be flowering in late May or early June, keep an eye out for the pretty cream coloured flowers and pick some to make this delicious cordial. The best flowers to use are ones that are just open and picked on a dry, sunny day.

25 elderflower heads
3 lemons - zest and juice
1.5 l water
1 kg sugar

Inspect the flowers for insects, shake to remove any then place the heads in a large bowl with the lemon zest

Bring the water to the boil and pour over the flowers and zest, cover and leave overnight

Strain the liquid through muslin or a jelly bag into a saucepan

Add the sugar and lemon juice and stir till the sugar dissolves, simmer for 2 minutes

Wash and sterilise bottles (either rinse out carefully with boiling water or wash and rinse before putting in the oven at 140c unit completely dry)

Pour the juice into bottles using a funnel or jug and seal immediately

You can also freeze some of the cordial in ice cube trays, then just pop one into a glass when you need a drink!

This recipe is from the new Penhurst Retreat Centre Cookery Book which contains lots of lovely recipes which are used at the Centre and some that the staff and volunteers have suggested. If you would like a copy of the Cookery Book they are for sale in the little shop at the Retreat Centre.

Messy People

It has always fascinated me that, at the Last Supper, when Jesus said, “One of you will betray me,” the disciples did not with one accord swing round and look at Judas. “Well, we all know who **that’s** going to be!” Rather they began to ask Jesus one by one, “Is it me?” All the disciples knew that they had it within themselves to fail, to let Jesus down, to make a mess of things.

But the great thing about Jesus was that he chose them all. And he loved and included each of them in his life and ministry, from Levi, the puppet of the Romans, to Simon the Zealot, who hated everything the Romans stood for. Jesus shared that last meal with them all, including Judas, and he washed his feet too.

An ability to deal with messy people is one of Jesus’ great gifts. He was relaxed in the company of the disreputable bunch of people that followed him round – the prostitutes, beggars, people with physical disabilities or despised ethnic groups. In fact he obviously liked these people and because of him they dared to believe that they could be part of the kingdom of God.

So often when we are going through a bad patch, and our lives are falling apart, we feel a sense of failure. Christians shouldn’t... have failed marriages, lose their temper, hate one another, be fed up with church, question what we’ve been taught as eternal truths. But often we do – and we get depressed. But God still loves us at those times. Psalm 103 says: “As a father has compassion on his children, so the Lord has compassion on those who fear him; for he knows how we are formed, he remembers that we are dust.”

When things go wrong, and we make a mess of life, we do not need to be paralysed by the thought that God is angry with us. God is not disillusioned by us. He never had any illusions in the first place. He knows we are dust. But he loves us *just as we are*, and longs for us to work with him in getting through the bad times and helping others through their bad times too.

Parish Council News

The sound of leather on willow heralds the start of spring perhaps more than does the cuckoo! It is also the season when everything kicks off at the pavilion. Popular as a venue all year round it comes into its own now the days are longer and warmer.



Along with the increase in activity because of cricket, it is also time to continue with the upkeep of the grounds and building. Fortunately, the annual income from letting fees is sufficient to cover costs in a normal year.

The building maintenance programme this year is to complete the interior decoration and to give the exterior cladding its periodic treatment. A number of one off projects are also in hand. These include landscaping around the concrete slab where the old pavilion stood and this is mostly funded from the residue of funds raised during the diamond jubilee year of HM The Queen. Other one off jobs are creating a gated entrance to the field at the New Buildings Farm end and putting up a suitable barrier in front of the hedge along the lane boundary. This is to stop cricket balls disappearing into the new hedge that is now coming into its third summer and starting to put on weight.

Finally, a legal agreement has been completed with the landlords, the Ashburnham Estate, permitting improvements to the entrance from the road. This was one of the preconditions of planning permission for the new village hall. The cost of the work is fully funded from our successful lottery fund bid to Awards for All last year.
