'Ordinary Time'

We are all familiar with the idea of seasons. For me, living in the countryside provides a deeper awareness and appreciation of the distinctiveness of each season: spring, summer, autumn and winter. Of course, 'seasons' can also relate to human life and experience. There are times of joy and times of sadness, times of learning, times of working, resting, loving, and losing. And, of course, in rural areas such as ours, it is good to acknowledge and celebrate the various agricultural seasons and events, such as Ploughing, Lambing, Rogation, Lammas and Harvest.

The Christian church also marks seasons that help to anticipate and celebrate, to learn and to live. This pattern is sometimes called the 'Church Year' or the 'Christian Calendar'. It has two main purposes: to retell and explore the story of God's love revealed through Jesus Christ and known through the church, and to connect that story to daily life for those who follow Him. Currently we are in what is known as '**Ordinary Time**', which began on Trinity Sunday (this year, 12 June) and continues until the fourth Sunday before Advent (this year, 30 October).

Now 'Ordinary Time' doesn't sound very exciting, does it? 'Ordinary' sounds rather dull, boring and mundane, hardly the stuff to excite and capture our attention! So, what is there to celebrate during weeks of 'ordinaries'? Can we really celebrate the 'mundane'? Well, I hope so!

Most of life is of course very ordinary. There are daily or weekly routines of shopping, washing, cleaning, gardening, working, looking after the children, or parents, or a neighbour's dog, putting out the recycling and the bins. Waking, washing, eating, working, eating, relaxing, sleeping – such is the 'rhythm of life'. For most of us these things are 'routine' and require little thought. It's often only when we are unable to do these everyday things, that we begin to fully appreciate them. For example, during the covid lockdowns we had to adapt to and accept a 'new normal'; as I write this article, I am mindful of those living in Ukraine whose 'ordinary' lives are no longer routine or predictable. While currently, the shortage of water means we all need to act responsibly in our use of this precious 'commodity', which we so often take for granted. For many people in different parts of the world drought has been a reality for many years and is getting worse. Furthermore, living in the beautiful area we do, it is so easy not to appreciate our surroundings; likewise, those in our families or community who enrich our lives.

Friends, I have a confession to make... I am not always mindful of God's work and generous provision in the little details of my everyday life. The fact that I wake up every morning is a miracle in itself! The ability to shower with clean, safe water is a gift. And the food I consume (our 'daily bread') is so easily taken for granted, along with the breath-taking sunset from the back of Agmerhurst Granary. These things can be reminders to us that we are loved, nurtured, and cared for every single moment of the day by a God who is 'ever faithful and ever sure'.



During this 'ordinary time' we have an opportunity to stop, think and reflect on those people, things, routines, that are so intrinsic to our day to day lives. In doing so we can begin to see more fully the wonder, beauty, truth and joy in the everyday routines and, within the 'Church Year' understand more fully the great truth that the festivals all point to: **that in Jesus Christ the eternal life of God is made visible in ordinariness.** Of course, Jesus Christ was 'extraordinary', but only because He first became utterly ordinary, born as one of us. This same Jesus called very ordinary people to be part of His new community, He used the most mundane things around Him to tell stories, illustrate the divine in our midst and open our eyes to the glory all around us and deep within us. He used fish and bread, wine and farming, working and weddings to illustrate the depth and breadth of His teaching and, most importantly, He did this not simply as visual aids pointing beyond themselves to something more important, but so that we might see wonder and glory IN the ordinary, the routine and the mundane all around us.

As we journey into autumn and continue in 'ordinary time' I hope I can become a little more attentive in these 'ordinary' months to the wonder, joy and presence that is all around and invite you to do the same. Watch out for the moments – they are very ordinary yet full of glory! God bless, *Gary*

Christmas Shoe Box Appeal 2022

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD sends a message of hope to children in desperate situations around the world through gift-filled shoe boxes. Operation Christmas Child is part of Samaritan's Purse, an international relief and development organisation that seeks to provide help and hope among communities in need across the world (such as countries in Sub-Saharan Africa, Eastern Europe and Central Asia).

The annual shoe-box appeal programme provides an opportunity for individuals of all ages to be involved in this simple hands-on project that reaches out to children who might otherwise have very little to look forward to this Christmas. Prayer and Pastoral Care for our Villages

Revd Gary Cregeen is responsible for the pastoral care of parishioners, and would welcome the opportunity to meet everyone. If you would value a visit, either for a chat, prayer, or Holy Communion at home, please contact him. Ashburnham Church regularly prays for everyone who lives and works in our villages and we are always happy to receive requests for prayer at our various services and meetings. There are also "Prayer Boxes" at St Peter's Church in Ashburnham Place, and outside Ashburnham Chapel at Pontois Green where you can write a card (anonymously if you wish) for a specific issue. These will be offered for prayer on a regular basis and dealt with in the strictest confidence. Ashburnham Church is open daily for private prayer too.

Gardening and Nature Notes

The dry, hot summer and drought has been difficult for much of our wildlife, plants and soil they rely on. I'm sure you've noticed trees starting to look autumnal in early August. This is a built in protective response, by shedding leaves the tree is reducing water lost through photosynthesis and protecting itself from further harm. The dry ground makes it difficult for some of our garden birds to successfully rear a second brood as worms disappear into deeper, moist soil. We were delighted to find a family of Spotted Flycatchers nesting in our woods. Watching the parents swooping to catch flies on the wing was captivating and three well fed youngsters fledged successfully. They will all be heading back to Africa this month for the winter! The drought has been hard on our gardens too, at home and work I have been taking note of which plants have been thriving and which are struggling. Much is said about planting drought tolerant mediterranean plants which can work well but might struggle on some of our heavy clay over the winter, they are used to free draining soil all year round! So far it seems that the Hydrangeas planted many years ago in one of our driest beds at work are struggling the most whilst Perovskia in the same bed are thriving with bright blue spikes of flowers showing off all summer. In the heavier clay areas, herbaceous Geraniums such as Rozanne and Pink Penny are doing well and Gaura seem fine whatever soil they are in! The annuals I'm most impressed with are some Nicotiana 'Sensation' which I grew from seed in the spring, they have thrived, grown tall and flowered all summer long without regular irrigation. I buy seeds from www.higgledygarden.com and highly recommend them. After planting I keep things irrigated as much as possible for the first season but after that they have to put up with conditions (apart from trees and woody shrubs which I irrigate for a couple of years). It's best to water well every few days rather than a little bit every day, this encourages deeper root growth and healthier plants.

Parish Council News

Whew! Thank goodness the heat relented to almost ideal conditions on the last Saturday of July. The Parish Council is a big supporter of the Country Fair and Flower Show and provides the marquee. But it is organised by a group of individuals once dubbed "A coalition of the willing." And what a triumph it was this year. We know from the takings on the gate that 877 adults paid their £2.50 entrance fee so there were clearly over 1,000 people at the grounds for a few hours. Some came from as far as London having been before and managing to organise their stay in Ashburnham to coincide with the date of the event.



A couple of weeks earlier the Vintage Motor Cycle Club held their annual show and concours and that was a similar success albeit on a smaller scale. Both these events are now firm fixtures in the calendar of summer events in the village.

The parish council meeting in July was the first with a full complement of councillors following the recent changes and members took the opportunity to revisit the allocation of lead responsibilities. A list of these is on the parish website, but councillors recognised that not every area which should engage the council can be covered from among the councillors. So they decided to engage 'correspondents' from among local residents with specialist knowledge or an interest in a particular area so that all areas are covered. As these are developed they will be added to the list on the parish website. If you think you can bring some specialist or niche knowledge or expertise to the table, please contact either the parish clerk or the Chairman, Richard White. Topics are not restricted in any way and certainly not to just those areas not specifically covered by a parish councillor. The wider we can spread the net the more likely we are to be relevant in our response to the wide range of issues and challenges we are all facing.




