The Sign of the Fish

Dear Friends,

‘So, what’s that on the back of your car?’ A question asked from time to time by the inquisitive. What is sometimes on the back of a car is the sign of the fish. It is the sign of the Christian and was an early symbol that has its origins in the 2nd century. During the 4th and 5th centuries the sign was often found in the catacombs combined with symbols of bread and wine to signify The Last Supper as instituted by Jesus on the night prior to his death.

The fish symbol was used because it was a way of making one known to fellow believers, at a time when to be open about the faith would have brought swift retribution by the Romans.

In the Greek of the day the word ‘fish’ was ‘Ichthus’, which as an acronym read: ‘Jesus Christ, Son of God, Saviour’. Today, when we see the sign of the fish often on the rear of cars, and sometimes as a lapel pin, we know that that person is a Christian. An even better reason for the driver to drive well!

Many people today wear signs of faith, be it a cross or the fish. Such signs are adverts of the Christian believer, but of course the very best advert is the life one leads. There have been many eloquent sermons preached down the years, but the best sermon of all is the life a person lives.

Jesus once said: ‘*by their fruits you shall know them*’.
It’s an important lesson for us *all*.



“Everybody wants to go to heaven, but no one wants to die” Anon

What do you think about death? When you can't get to sleep at night, and that pain comes on again. Or when someone you know who is younger than you dies. Or when you watch a death-bed scene on the television and lie awake wondering how you will face it.

The trouble is, it's not like the dentist, whose appointments you can put off. Or like the flu, that may pass you by this winter. It is a certainty. Everyone who has ever lived has died, and one day – perhaps soon, if you are a good age – you too will die. Our society, our health service – our churches, even – do not really acknowledge the inevitability of death. No matter how old you are, doctors and surgeons will fight to put you right. Church congregations will pray for your complete healing. Friends will visit and say, “Oh no, you'll soon be up and about again...!”

With the recent deaths of Yensie Harmer and Dolly Lovett, we are reminded that in our community we have many who are coming towards the end of their lives. Some may be fit and well, still driving and still active. They may have lots of friends and loving families, but I'm pretty sure they think about death sometimes. And the problem comes when they are forced to think about it alone, because there is no one to talk it over with. Our families hate us to talk about dying, and our friends want to be upbeat and encouraging.

There are organisations now that understand that this is an important issue for people to grapple with. There are Death Cafes, where you can go and chat over coffee and cake about the end of life. They cover practical issues: do you have a will? Does your family know what funeral arrangements you would like? Have you made it clear if you want to be buried or cremated? Are you going to put in place a “do not resuscitate” order so that in the event of a major stroke or heart attack, strenuous efforts are not made to keep you alive? Have you talked to your family about that? Because when the time comes, they will want to do everything they can to keep you with them.

The best advice would be not to think about your death on a bad day, when you feel low anyway, but to choose a beautiful day, and perhaps sit down with a good friend and share your thoughts. Talk through your fears, your wishes and your doubts. That way there will be at least one person who will know what you want when the time comes.

Maybe we should have a “death morning” in the Orangery, when we can all go and “speak about the unspeakable” over coffee and homemade cake...!

Ashburnham Church Hall

The Church Hall is situated in the grounds of Ashburnham Place, tucked just inside the wall of the Kitchen Garden. It is used for Sunday school, the Play Cafe, coffee after the Sunday morning service and the occasional Sunday shared lunch.

The building consists of one large room, two smaller rooms, two WCs and a very well equipped kitchen. There is a small garden at the back. Village residents are welcome to use the facilities for children's parties, coffee mornings, teas, committee meetings, etc, and we simply ask for a donation towards the upkeep of the hall.

The Ashburnham Estate – A Family History

There are not many left in Ashburnham and Penhurst who remember it personally, but 65 years ago this year a major event occurred in the history of these villages: Lady Catherine Ashburnham died.

As the eldest daughter of Bertram, the 5th Earl of Ashburnham, she had come out of training to be a nun in order to inherit Ashburnham Place and the 20,000 acres around it that represented the Ashburnham Estate from her uncle Thomas, the 6th Earl, who died in 1924.



When Lady Catherine died in 1953 with no children, the law of inheritance sought the nearest male heir. Her grandfather, Bertram, the 4th Earl, had seven sons and four daughters. Amazingly not one of those sons had a surviving son but one of the daughters, Lady Margaret Ashburnham (my great grandmother) married John Joseph Bickersteth and had two sons. The eldest, Edward had died in 1945, and the younger Richard Bickersteth was Lady Catherine's Land Steward, managing the Estate. He lived at Agmerhurst House and was known locally as "Mr Richard."

Despite having two sisters, as the eldest male it was Edward's youngest child, John (my father), who inherited Ashburnham Place and the Estate. John was training to be a Vicar in the Church of England when he received a call during the night from his Uncle Richard: *"Good news and bad news, John! The good news is you have inherited an 8,500 acre estate and 82-roomed mansion; but the bad news is you have 70% death duty tax to pay, and the house is condemned due to dry rot, so you need to get down here urgently to sort it all out and pay the tax!"*

The way in which he achieved this and paid the £427,000 tax bill was quite complicated. Firstly, he had to sell the vast majority of the Estate and wonderful historic art and furniture collections. Later he gave Ashburnham Place and 220 acres surrounding it to a charitable trust to be a Christian prayer and conference centre. Then down the years he also had to sell off the brickyard, the forge, the post office and other cottages. What remained of the Estate (some 2,000 acres of farm/woodland & 47 cottages), my father put into different trusts, at the same time dispensing with the principle of the eldest son inheriting everything.

Since then, he (and, after his death, the family) have sought to manage the Estate in a way that retains the uniqueness of where we live. Those who have lived here since 1953 will have seen significant changes as the Estate has had to adapt to new legislation as well as the challenges of modern farming. The next few years – let alone 65 years – will, I am sure, be no less dramatic, especially given the Brexit vote!

Remembrance Sunday 11th November 2018, 10.45 am
