

"Forgive, as you have been forgiven..."

Does the name Stephen Oake ring any bells with you? He was a 40-year-old Special Branch Officer who was murdered some years ago during an anti-terrorist operation in Manchester. According to police reports, Stephen was fatally stabbed in the chest 'in the line of duty'. The anguish and agony which this brief incident represented is quite incalculable. In the news bulletins that followed a brief 30 second statement from Stephen's dad, Robin Oake, former Chief Constable of the Isle of Man, and one of the founders of the Christian Police Association in the Metropolitan Police, said, "This is a very hard blow to take, as you can imagine. But in the police force one has to expect the unexpected. I am praying hard for Stephen's wife Lesley and the children, as well as my wife and the wider family. I am praying hard for the fellow who stabbed Steve. I am trying hard to forgive him as I am sure Steve would. I am praying that the perpetrator may now seek God himself and find peace and forgiveness with Him. I don't want any recrimination against him at all." This brief statement sums up the power of the Christian Gospel in a sentence. At a time when people would have expected a violent outburst about judgement and retribution they heard about love. It ranked for me as one of those rare moments in the media when the redemptive power of Jesus goes beyond the politics of human beings. The love of God more powerful than the violent deeds of evildoers.

Friends, forgiveness is never easy, but it is vital. We are all human. We make mistakes and we hurt each other. Unforgiveness is at the root of so much anger, quarrelling, division, slander, gossip, arrogance and disorder. Jesus tells us, in Matthew's gospel chapter 18, that forgiveness is crucial for all relationships: for marriage, family life, church life, relationships at work and in the community and for our eternal destiny. Indeed, Jesus commands His followers to offer unlimited forgiveness; an attitude He demonstrated when enduring the pain and the humiliation of the cross when He said "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do". Forgiving others who have wronged us, or someone we love, is a big 'call' isn't it? It's an act of the will, we can choose to offer forgiveness or withhold it. I wonder, as you read this article, is there someone who comes to mind whom you need to forgive? Then, choose to forgive them; God is ready to help us in this if we ask Him - Robin Oake bears testimony to this. Too often an unforgiving spirit, sometimes going back a long time, spoils relationships in the home, in the church, and in the community. Why not ask God to help you make forgiveness a lifetime habit? We can forgive, not in our own strength, but out of the overflow of forgiveness that God has shown us, 'For He has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son He loves, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.' - Colossians:1: 13 & 14.

Christmas at Ashburnham and Penhurst Churches

Thank you to all those who attended the various Christmas and End of Year Church Services at Penhurst and Ashburnham. The evening Candlelit Carol Service at Penhurst attracted lots of people and the refreshments served afterwards at the Manor House (Penhurst Retreat Centre) were greatly appreciated. A retiring collection raised over £235 which was split between The Snowflake Trust (a charity helping the homeless in Hastings), and CAP (Christians Against Poverty) who provide debt advice and help to those struggling to make ends meet in Bexhill and the surrounding area. 'Carols Around The Crib' on Christmas Eve at Ashburnham attracted another large congregation of all ages. The church was lit almost entirely by candles, which made the service very atmospheric. Music was provided by Hannah Latty, with contributions from the ACT Christmas Gospel Choir. A wooden stable, beautifully made by David Boorman, provided a focus for the service as knitted characters were added as the events of the first Christmas were re-told. A retiring collection raised over £180, which was divided equally between charities actively providing help and support to those in need in Ukraine, Gaza and Madagascar. It was a delight to see Ashburnham Church full again on Christmas morning; likewise, the End of Year Service at Penhurst the following Sunday, when over £200 was donated to the Tony Hudgell Foundation. Tony is a little boy who endured life-changing injuries because of abuse as a baby. Now nine-years old the double amputee has captured hearts with his bravery, optimism, and infectious smile; he was recently awarded a BEM in the New Year's Honours List.

Lent 2024: A Journey Through Lent

Lent provides an opportunity to reflect and to 'take stock' of our lives in relation to God. The 40 days represent the time Jesus Himself spent fasting and praying in the wilderness before He began His public ministry.

This year a five-week Lent Course will be held in the Church Hall (within the walled garden at Ashburnham Place, access by car via Kitchenham Road only). These informal meetings will take place on Thursday evenings during Lent, between 7.30 pm and 9 pm. With a mix of Bible study and discussion the course will help us understand the significance of this season and to reflect on our own life journey, not least in relation to the death and resurrection of Jesus which we commemorate and celebrate at Easter.

Lent begins on ASH WEDNESDAY, 14 th February, and there will be an ASH WEDNESDAY HOLY COMMUNION at 10.30 am at Ashburnham Church that day, to which anyone would be welcome. HAZEL LODGE CARE HOME

Hazel Lodge is a purpose-built care home on the outskirts of Battle, a residential home which provides long term and respite care as well as support and care for those living with dementia. In recent months Julie and I have had cause to visit Hazel Lodge as Julie's Mum, who currently lives independently near Whitstable, was diagnosed with vascular dementia last year. A time may come when she may need the care a place like Hazel Lodge is able to offer. Anyhow, to cut a long story short, I was asked if I could conduct a Church Service at Hazel Lodge for residents.

Consequently, it has been agreed that a short Church Service (around half an hour) will now take place on the third Thursday of each month at 10.45 am. This will coincide with the Thursday Coffee Mornings, hosted by Hazel Lodge, and visitors could come along to the Service, should they wish to come along.

The first Service will be on Thursday 15th February at 10.45 am in the Main Lounge, Hazel Lodge, Battle.

If possible, it would be great if a small team could accompany me to deliver these Services and to get alongside residents. Nick Iglinski has already offered to accompany me with his accordion! If this is something you would be interested in being involved with then please do get in touch. Also, I am mindful that within Ashburnham and Penhurst there are those living with dementia – if this is you, or someone you know, why not come along on the third Thursday of each month? 

Parish Council News

Potholes continue to make the news for all the wrong reasons. At Ponts Green a resident kept a record of the number of vehicles damaged by hitting the pothole outside their house. There were five and they were not trivial.

When Balfour Beatty took over the East Sussex Highways contract in April 2023 we rather naively hoped that things would improve.

And they have, in terms of communication and liaison with the parish council. The new



Stakeholder Liaison Team are more responsive and there are said to be more boots on ground in terms of Highways Stewards. What was naïve was to think that there might be any more resources available to actually mend the roads. We hear of additional government funding for roads and no doubt East Sussex is getting its share. But as we all know there comes a point where infrastructure deteriorates to such an extent that it's like putting a sticking plaster on a broken bone.

To add insult to injury utilities' infrastructure is also deteriorating so that a burst water main shut Hammer Hill twice in early January as the leak washed away part of the road. And BT frequently close roads to replace ageing telegraph poles. If you thought there was a master plan of road closures recall the time before Christmas when the diversion set up for a one day BT road closure directed traffic down Farthing Lane which of course has been closed since the beginning of November due to the bridge structure being eroded by water which overflowed the culvert because it's not been cleared properly for several years. Honestly, you couldn't make it up.

Please be assured that your Parish Council is communicating with the various powers that be concerning these issues. We can't promise fast progress but we will keep making our (your) voice heard! Thank goodness February is really too late to wish anyone a Happy New Year.





Murmurations - Donna Christman

Is it too late to wish you a happy new year? Like a birthday it's not over until the next one comes around! I have a winter birthday so, like melted mozzarella, I string it out to an impressive length otherwise I just don't get to birthday-bask in the daylight hours that a summer- born enjoys. My cards stay up for weeks because if some kind soul has remembered, been organised, and been generous with the investment of their time (and a stamp) then whatever pops out of that hand-written envelope, whether purchased or painted, will be very much appreciated.

If February doesn't find you quite as resolute in your resolutions as in early January, or even resolutely resolution-less then, either way, it's a good time to take a leaf from the book of the Danish who have spent centuries refining their cold-weather coping mechanisms. At this time of year, they are kind to themselves, valuing connection and cosiness, and embracing the chill with hot drinks, fires, and friends. Rather than taking on new challenges in what may still feel like the depths of winter it's a better time to release what no longer serves us. Much like the trees, which have shed their leaves and dead wood, stark against skies of slate and pewter, we can quietly reflect, conserve our energy, and let go of what's not needed.

Time for ourselves right now can be spent giving space and attention to deepening and slowing our breath, this not only frees the mind from the constant busyness of the world around us but gives every cell (view each cell as a 'mini-me') the oxygen it needs to function effectively, this in turn supports the various systems and organs of the body to perform as they should - and as they know how to when given the right environment. (Good hydration - drinking enough water - goes hand-in-hand with breath awareness in improving cell, and whole body, health.)

Gifting ourselves just 10 minutes of this practice each day is far more beneficial, and certainly more illuminating than, say, watching the news or screen-scrolling. Focussing on our breath not only lowers blood pressure and slows the heart rate but reduces feelings of stress or anxiety, aids sleep and improves memory. Giving our mind respite from the noise and pace of life in this way also promotes clarity of thought, allowing solutions to problems the space to bubble to the surface; there's no need to focus on anything apart from the breath during this quiet time. Just 'be'. Later, in the sunny spring months, having cleared and cared for both mind and body in the colder times, intentions can be more positively set for the year ahead.
