'I SHALL NOT BE SHAKEN'

Some time ago I read a book by the mountaineer, Joe Simpson. Touching The Void is a detailed account of a climb he and his climbing partner, Simon Yates, undertook in 1985. They had just reached the top of a 21,000-foot peak in the Andes when disaster struck. Simpson plunged off the vertical face of an ice ledge, breaking his leg. In the hours that followed, darkness fell and a blizzard raged as Yates tried to lower his friend to safety. With much effort and determination they managed to get so far when Joe fell down a crevasse – he hung on the end of a rope for what seemed an eternity. There was no way he could get out and it was almost certain that Simon would also be pulled to an early death as well. Finally, Simon was forced to cut the rope and Joe fell.

The next three days were an impossibly gruelling ordeal for both men. Simon, certain that Joe was dead, returned to base camp consumed with grief and guilt over abandoning him. Miraculously, Joe survived the fall but, crippled, starving, and severely frostbitten, was trapped in a deep crevasse. Summoning vast reserves of physical and spiritual strength, Joe hopped, hobbled, and crawled over the cliffs and canyons of the Andes, reaching the base hours before Simon had planned to break camp – it had taken four days! But he demonstrated great determination and resolve.

This story came to mind when I was reading Psalm 16 recently. This Psalm rings with hope and confidence in God; it exemplifies a deep trust in God in both life and death. The psalmist, though acknowledging past troubles and personal struggles, celebrates the goodness of God that he has experienced in his life. His great determination and resolve are expressed so firmly in five simple but powerful words: 'I shall not be shaken'.

The secret of the psalmist's confidence is his trust in GOD. At the beginning he prays that God will be his keeper and his guardian: "Keep me safe...", but it's a prayer that is based on trust, "...in you I take refuge". The psalmist found his shelter and security in God; he also submitted to God as his Master: "You are my Lord, apart from you I have no good thing".

Now it could be argued the world of the psalmist was very different to our own and conclude that such hope and confidence is 'unrealistic' in our contemporary world. As wars continue, people struggle to make ends meet, many navigate broken and fragile relationships and illness encroaches, the 'feel good factor' expressed by the psalmist can seem like wishful thinking.

However, the psalmist lived in a world that was equally violent, equally uncertain, and equally threatening, as our own. Yet we in the midst of all the pressures of life and the threats he faced he declared, "I have set the Lord always before me. Because the Lord is at my right hand I shall not be shaken". Psalm 16 is a wonderful reminder of the sufficiency and faithfulness of God, who invites us to trust Him and know for ourselves that peace and confidence that He can give.

At last there is something to celebrate with regard to public transport within the parishes. FlexiBus is a new service to Rother. Its Services run 7am to 7pm, Monday to Saturday (not Sundays or Bank holidays). FlexiBus is a flexible, ondemand rideshare service, for areas with limited or no bus service. Residents can book a FlexiBus journey to their nearest town, train station, hospital and other key destinations.



FlexiBus operates exclusively for places not served by a regular transport service and so you can't book a FlexiBus journey to travel along an existing public transport route. The area covered by Flexibus is divided into zones and there is a map online showing the zones. There is an 'Address' search box so that you can find out which zone an address is in.

However, you don't need to be a techie to make a booking although there is an app (Ride Pingo). A telephone is all you need. Recent experience of a guest at Penhurst Retreat was glowing in its praise of the service they received by telephoning 01273 078203 where an agent will sort everything out for you to book your planned journey.



Murmurations - Donna Christman

Last month, after writing about the myriad of health benefits of grounding due to the exchange of electrons between our bodies and the earth - largely lost to us humans since the introduction of synthetic soles - I came across this by Andrea Gibson: "The leaves are all falling, and they're falling like they're falling in love with the ground." Nice...

As I write in balmy September, our apples have also been falling to the ground like they're in love with it – gently nudged, but also forcefully wacked, with long implements... protective head-wear necessary. Black buckets. (Apparently a local lady once lost a front tooth in a falling apple incident.)

Anyway the Pressing Place beckons apples large and small, ready or not. Those to escape the juicer fell in love with the ground some weeks ago and are now being squabbled over by wasps. Or the two large goats that came for a short (but mischievous) stay. They're also loving the blackberries and, standing up on their back legs, have an impressive reach. Clever too. I can pop a trug on a curly horn, give them flour, sugar and butter - and the oven settings for a crumble.

Anyway, our apple-bashing day proves to be risky business for the sack-holders and picker-uppers who suffer injuries due to lack of protective equipment. The apples were the least problem; it was the bucket-wearing stick-brandishers that proved the most dangerous with their erratic swinging and misguided pommelling. Me, I got a sack, not a bucket-helmet, so had to be as nimble as a netballer, dodging left and right to avoid the attacking team, and charging down the sloped pitch after stock that got away.

Throughout our apple gathering party (at which there were no chilled ciders, Sauvignon Blancs or caterers on account of the extent of the orchard - six trees) sacks were filled and humped, barrows wheeled and dragged and produce loaded into a sturdy vehicle. As the sun drowsily slumped on the horizon, the cheery people at Ringden Farm were washing their feet, linking arms and treading the sweet and sour juice out of our Pippins and Bramleys ... heartily singing Oats and Beans and Barley Grow.

The unfortunate lady who lost her tooth in the freak apple- harvesting incident ended up, I gather, paying a small fortune for a crown replacement. Life's a learning game!

Garden and Nature Notes

I was looking back over some photographs when I was thinking about this column, and marvelling at the range of wildlife we have seen in the garden recently - a gorgeous grass snake swimming across the pond; a teenage Tawny Owl finding its voice in the Oak tree just behind the house; a Silver Washed Fritillary Butterfly landing on Water Mint and a Heron visiting regularly to stalk fish in the ponds.

I try and keep lists of the insects, animals and birds that we see at home and have recently started to upload records to irecord (www.irecord.org.uk) which describes its aims as follows,

"The goal of iRecord is to make it easier for wildlife sightings to be collated, checked by experts and made available to support research and decision-making at local and national levels. Join iRecord now to share your sightings with the recording community, explore dynamic maps and graphs of your data and make a real contribution to science and conservation."

It's a great resource, experts check your findings if you're able to include photos and you can easily look back over your own records and those of others posted in this area.

I was treated to an unexpected sight recently, about 20 White Storks circling high in the sky above Ashburnham Place. One of my colleagues there, a keen birder, spotted them and pointed them out, even high up you could see how large they were and different to anything else in the sky. There is a fairly new breeding population at Knepp in West Sussex where they have been reintroduced but there are also migratory groups this time of year.

In the garden seed heads are taking over from flowers and I have been collecting Corncockle, Love in a Mist, Marigold and Cornflowers to grow again next year. I am also planning to gather some tree seeds, including from Wild Service Trees (Sorbus terminals) in Ashburnham Place. These trees, which used to be commonplace in our woodlands are becoming increasingly rare so it will be good to try and grow some seedlings. Growing trees takes patience, most seeds need a period of cold to kickstart germination so need to be left outside in pots over winter, some for more than one season! You can circumvent this by freezing the seeds but it can be tricky to get the timings right. It will be worth doing though to raise a new generation of trees to plant out here.
