MR BATES vs THE POST OFFICE

'We're here because the Post Office told every single one of us sat here today, told us over and over, "You're the only one." And that was wrong. That was a lie actually, because... well, look at us. Here we all are. And from this moment forwards, none of us will be the only one ever again'.

It's hard to believe that ITV's Mr Bates vs The Post Office isn't just a true story, but one still being played out. The horrendous injustice suffered by hundreds of sub postmasters caught up in this scandal has been described as the biggest miscarriage of justice in British legal history, with enormous human cost. Horizon, the computer system rolled out to each post office, incorrectly showed huge account shortfalls. These were then blamed on sub-postmasters, who were told that nobody else had had any issues, that they were the only one. Except they weren't – and the Post Office knew this. How frightening to believe that, facing a sudden debt of thousands of pounds and the possibility of bankruptcy or prison, you were utterly alone.

Sadly, the themes in this debacle are not new. The psalms and the prophets, found in the Bible, are full of the anguished cries of those who struggle – 'How long O God?' and serve as a vision of the transformation of society through 'doing justice, loving mercy, and walking humbly before God' (Micah 6 verse 8). Such a worldview involves caring for the vulnerable and working for the flourishing of everyone.

Alan Bates emerges from this story as a heroic figure. An unassuming but tenacious man, he led the fight against the Post Office for over 20 years, a David against a seemingly all-powerful corporate Goliath. Unwilling to stand by and watch others endure injustice, he stood up for, and stood by, those who had no fight left in themselves, to show them they were not alone.

Thus, the outcry against the Post Office is welcome. After all, we all – individually and collectively – cry out for justice. We want to live in a society when justice is done. For Christians, God is a God of justice and calls on those who follow Him to reflect His character and priorities. Furthermore, God not only stands with those who suffer but, in the person of Jesus Christ, He experienced suffering and injustice Himself on the cross at Calvary.

Friends, we may never have to battle like Alan Bates and the sub postmasters (or those affected by the contaminated blood scandal) but each of us may, in some way, be called to be mouthpieces for truth and justice in our homes, workplaces, or community. This will demonstrate to those facing unfairness and injustice they are not alone. We are with them and, as a Christian, I believe that God is there with them too.

ASHBURNHAM ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING (APCM)

At St Peter's APCM on 21 st April 2024 Catherine Duggleby and John French were re-appointed as Churchwardens. Revd Gary thanked them for their valued and faithful service, support and encouragement. Fay Ramsden was elected to serve on the Parochial Church Council (PCC) and Rachel Bickersteth was elected to represent the Parish on the Battle & Bexhill Deanery Synod.

ROGATION SERVICE

We were blessed with fine weather for this year's Rogation Service at Kitchenham Farm. The Service included a short circular walk, stopping at different places to take in the surrounding scenery to remind ourselves of all the work that goes on in our communities, to give thanks to God, and to seek His blessing. This festival has been celebrated for centuries. However, at the time of the Reformation the practice of 'processions' was suppressed, but parish 'perambulations' (the act of walking around, surveying land, beating the bounds) were encouraged! A royal injunction by Elizabeth 1 ordered the 'perambulation of every parish' at Rogationtide and two special homilies were printed, to ensure clergy could explain to their congregations what this festival was all about. One of these homilies stated: 'in our walks on these days' people have occasion to behold the fields and countryside and to ask God in prayer for their fruitfulness and for seasonable weather!' It also reminded people to be content rather than greedy, and not to "covet or contentiously strive" for what belongs to their neighbour or the next-door parish! Also, a practical point is made about... noticing the need for road repairs! "Your highways should be considered in your walks, to understand where to bestow your days' works according to the good statutes provided for the same". Thus, as people walked, they saw what needed doing: "It is a good deed of mercy to amend the dangerous and noisome ways, whereby thy neighbour, sitting upon his silly weak beast, floundereth not in the deep thereof..." It's said 'there's nothing new under the sun' – clearly this includes potholes!

After the Service refreshments were enjoyed in the gardens of Kitchenham Farm. Donations amounted to £143 to be split equally between Bexhill & Battle Foodbank and Sussex based charity, Family Support Work. Sincere thanks to Amanda and Monty Worsam for their generous hospitality (and to those who baked cakes!), and to all involved in any way.

Remembering D-Day and the Battle of Normandy

The D-Day landings of 6 June 1944 was the largest seaborne invasion in history. Along with the associated airborne operations, it marked the beginning of the liberation of France and western Europe. Parish Council news –

As Spring rolls into Summer so the admin year, generally ending on 31st March, rolls over into a new admin period. The roll over is punctuated with AGM's and Annual Meetings involving the village hall, the two parishes and the Parish Council.

The village hall Sole Managing Trustee, newly appointed in November 2022, spent its first full year finding out what was expected of it. Now entering its second full year it is overseeing some overdue improvements to the kitchen and the car park. With an increasing number of users, the trustee Annual General Meeting had its best ever attendance with the promise of some active fund raising. This is timely as the fund raising pot kept in the Appeal Fund has now been used up on the current improvements.

The Annual Village Meetings saw some lively, but generally good natured, exchanges arising from the decision by those actively supporting and fund raising for a new village hall at the cricket ground to wind down the project as the prospects of it going forward were disappearing. The Village Meeting asked the Parish Council to write to this group urging them to use the unspent funds raised for an alternative project which would benefit the village. The letter was sent and can be found on the village website.

The last of the roll over events is the Parish Council's annual meeting in May at which members elect a Chairman for the ensuing year. By now the details will have been posted on the village website.





Murmurations

We're racing around the house grabbing paraphernalia for an impromptu, High Weald camping weekend with friends. It's barely May - the veil between spring and summer when the sky may be blue and hung with starched, blousy clouds - or these might heap into piles, to gather and spill. It's both warm and puddly when we arrive on site to find *Vehicle Pushing* an important element of the *Planned Activities*, along with axe throwing, tossing the caber and fire-twirling. Safe family fun. The campsite is a perfect example of a micro-community: old and young, side-by-side, preparing food; cooking, splitting logs, collecting water; lighting fires and washing up. Simple... (Great satisfaction can also be had from visiting the blue Portaloo and finding a good roll of tissue paper. Little things!)

The canine campers scoot around our oak-bordered clearing like smug escapees from Battersea Dogs Home, hustling and jostling each other - jaws on legs, pinning one another down, asserting themselves, then moderating with a yelp or a growl. After their scuffles the dogs pause to shake off their irritations before dashing off to re-join the pack; living in the moment, they let go of what they don't need. Of course, there are camp duties for the dogs as well: the medium mutts work together to claim as many vacant camp chairs as possible; the Labradors (and part Labradors) tidy away food scraps - any food in fact - quickly and efficiently; the pocket pooches challenge any remaining aspects of the risk assessment not already breached, by tripping people into the fire. One dog stands out, a handsome, well-built mongrel, wearing an important, multi-pocketed, khaki jacket-cum-harness; he adopts the role of security guard, keeping the lot of us in check.

As the fire circle grows, conversation flows from photography to architecture, fishing to cooking, hot-air ballooning to geo-engineering ... oh, and the benefits of raw milk.

As the sun slumps onto the land our eclectic 'Stick It On' tunes rise to mingle with wood-smoke. And now it's dark and the TALENT SHOW kicks off. A drum kit appears, guitars, an amp, a fiddle, singers, dancers. We are treated to solos, duets, and trios, between which poets perform and fire twirlers whirl (and the dogs spin into an over-stimulated frenzy until they collapse exhausted babandons his nightly round to dance in the fire-light. This is living life right now, and, as yawns multiply across the embers and we begin to drift to bed, the closing song ends with the words, "... brought up slow, feeling wild and free."
