'Faster, Higher, Stronger'

During the 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games in Paris, a global audience will watch as 10,500 athletes seek to earn a podium position and etch their name into Olympic and Paralympic Games history. Do you have a 'stand out' Olympian, either past or present? For me, Eric Liddell is 'up there' among the Olympic greats.

Liddell was born in 1902 in China to Christian missionaries from Scotland. While his parents continued to work in China, Liddell was educated in London and, at an early age, became a Christian himself. He took his faith seriously, always mindful that as Jesus Christ had died for him, so his life should be spent serving other people and God.

At school Liddell was an outstanding sportsman, and while studying science at university he played for Scotland's national rugby team. In 1923 he shifted focus to athletics, where he was soon recognised as the fastest runner in Scotland. Consequently, he was selected for the then Team GB in the 1924 Olympics in Paris; Liddle was deemed to be the likely winner of the 100m sprint. However, in response to what God had done for him Liddell determined to keep Sunday free from sport – needless to say, when he heard the 100m heats would be held on a Sunday, he refused to take part. It was a courageous decision which provoked enormous pressure, from the Olympics management and the popular press, to change his mind. However, he refused to compromise his faith and instead trained for the 200m and 400m races – he won bronze in the 200m but was not expected to do well at 400m.

On the morning of the race Liddell was handed a slip of paper on which was written the Bible quote: 'He who honours me (God), I will honour'. Encouraged, Liddell took the race at sprint pace and won, breaking Olympic and world records. Already well-known because of the battle with his principles, Liddell's dramatic and surprising victory made him a global celebrity.

After the Olympics, Liddell rejected various appealing opportunities in sport by announcing his firm conviction to serve God in China, where he became a teacher in a Christian college in 1925. Five years later he returned to Scotland to be trained as a church minister, before returning to China, where he married his wife. During the 1930's a brutal three-way war between the Nationalists, the Communists and the invading Imperial Japanese Army, made life in China increasingly perilous. In 1941 British nationals were advised to leave. Liddell's children and his wife – pregnant with their third child – left. But Liddell stayed and along with other missionaries was imprisoned in a brutal prison camp in 1943. He continued to help the elderly, encourage the depressed, resolve quarrels, and teach the Bible. He also prayed for the inmates and his captors.

Malnourished, Liddell's health failed and in 1945, just five months before liberation, he died from a brain tumour aged just 43. Although Eric Liddell was widely mourned at the time of his death, he was soon forgotten. However, his story returned to the world's attention in 1981 with the Oscar-winning film, Chariots of Fire.

Those who knew Eric Liddell recalled how he shone as a man who lived for others because he lived for Christ. Clearly, he was a man of conviction and compassion who, for me, remains an inspiration.

Parish Council News

When the Parish Council levelled some recriminations at East Sussex Highways over the collapse of the Farthing Lane bridge they were quickly batted away. The Parish Council said that it would be keen to know what future measures would be put in place to keep the culvert under the road clear of debris so that water no longer flowed across the road when there was heavy rain. The Parish Council's assertion is that overflowing the road is a recent phenomena, say over the past four years, prior to which Highways had kept the culvert clear. As a direct result of water flowing over the road the retaining wall was eroded and collapsed.



The reply came back that with over 1000 bridges to maintain, Highways do not have the resources to keep the culvert clear and that bankside landowners also have a part to play in maintaining vegetation along the banks of the stream just as landowners do with hedges abutting the highway.

This is going to cause a rethink about the role of the Parish Council if Highways are going to step back. In the coming months you can expect to see discussions starting with land owners and tenants to chart a way forward. As this magazine arrives so does a new government. A recent incoming administration was handed a note from The Treasury, "Sorry, there's no money". This time it will be worse, a second line, "and there are lots of debts." And with East Sussex County Council, in common with most others, now spending two thirds of their budget on Adult Social Care and care for the homeless (compared with half in 2010), maintenance in the rural environment won't improve any time soon.

For now, enjoy the summer and the events such as the Vintage Motor Cycle concours and the Country Fair and Flower Show in July plus lots of cricket at the weekends.





Murmurations

It's early one summer morning and I'm talking to a dog-walker on the highest swathe of Pevensey beach. Valerian (in shades of pink and cream), silvery sea kale, crimson poppies and bold ox-eye daisies are in abundance all around us. I don't mind the break and a chat before I turn back. I've just run a long way along the eastern curve of the bay on the wet sand of the low spring tide, jumping the salty streams and wading out a little here and there to find stranded-spit islands of my own.

One of the lures of the coast is the ever-changing view and the beach homes here, strung along the shingle, have no need of TVs; the clouds, sea and beach, the colours and wildlife - birds, foxes and seals - give plenty of passive entertainment. There is normally a racy south-westerly breeze which pushes the weather across the frame of sight: one moment there's blue sky, bright and breezy with seagulls gliding and clouds scudding across and the next, an ethereal light as the sky darkens in the west, heavy as lead; the gulls lift and plunge while the sea becomes an irritable steely-grey. There's always change here, and always change in life. As I return to the shoreline for my run back, (I have to be somewhere soon) I realise that this constant state of flow and flux has caught me out... the tide has turned and just a tiny sliver of sand remains; there is only the pebbly sweep of the bay the whole way back and I'm barefoot! Carefully, I run.

Grounding (connecting our electrical bodies with the electrons of the earth) has many health benefits, and occasional disadvantages. As I run, I recall barefooting on beaches in the past - happy memories including: the occasion I trod on a weaver fish; the moment I dropped deep into a gaping, bubbly hole of sinking sand; the time I got caught by a fish-hook, and the stubbing of my big toe on a small rock. These are now reminders for me to be in the moment, observant and mindful. Grounding reduces inflammation (and pain); increases energy (yet aids sleep); supports adrenal health; normalises blood pressure; lowers stress and protects our bodies from electro-magnetic radiation. Walking, sitting or lying with our skin in contact with the earth or body of water is our free natural resource. We can combine this with the positive effects of exposing at least forty percent of our bare skin to the sunlight, which generates the body's natural production of vitamin D - essential for supporting our immune system. So, enjoy the summer - however you do it!


