



The Clerk replied on March 30th that the contents of our letter was noted. Since then nothing has been done and we now feel that pressure should be brought to bear on the Council to put the road into proper repair so that users need not travel over it at great risk of damage to themselves and to their vehicles. So far as we are aware no substantial repairs have been carried out on this road for the past 4 years and it is

already becoming unsafe for traffic passing over it as this road is practically the only means of approach to this Parish from Battle Boxhill or Warblham I am now requested to ask that the County Council will look carefully into the matter with a view of some steps being taken which will result in the road being adequately repaired at an early date. If the County Surveyor cares to meet our Chairman = Mr J Norris of Kilburn on the spot he will be only too pleased to help matters forward by such an interview but in any event we shall be grateful if you would place this letter before the Roads & Bridges committee for their consideration
