Swiss Roll for Class 42

4 large eggs

Preheat Oven to 220°C/Fan 200°C/Gas 7

100g caster sugar

 $100\mathrm{g}$ self raising flour - regular or gluten free (please note on label)

For the Filling - 4 table spoons strawberry or raspberry jam

Grease a 13x9" swiss roll tin and line with baking parchment

Whisk eggs and sugar until mixture is light and frothy. Sift the flour into the mixture, folding it in. Turn into prepared tin, give it a gentle shake so the mixture finds its own level.

Bake in pre-heated oven for 10 mins or until the sponge is golden brown. While cooling, place a piece of baking parchment a little bigger than the size of the tin onto the work surface and dust with icing sugar. Invert the cake onto the parchment, remove the parchment from the base of the cake. Trim the edges and score a line 1" from one shorter edge.

Leave to cool slightly, spread with jam and roll up the cake firmly from the scored end. Recipe from Mary Berry's Baking Bible BBC Books.

Rules for Competitors

- Only one exhibit per person may be entered in any one class
- All fruit, vegetables, herbs and flowers must be grown by the exhibitor (except where indicated in floristry classes)
- All produce, photography, art, crafts and junior class entries must be the work of the exhibitor
- Judges may withhold prizes if they consider the exhibits not worthy of winning, or if there are insufficient entries in a class
- Reasonable care will be taken of the exhibits but the committee cannot accept any claims for damage or loss
- The judges' decisions are final
- All exhibits must be staged between 8.30am and 10am on Saturday 30th July, after which time no other exhibits will be accepted and only the judges and stewards may remain in the tent until the end of judging
- All cakes, biscuits, breads and other cooked food must be covered with cling film before being exhibited
- Exhibits must be left in position until 4pm and should be removed before 4.30pm. Any exhibits left in the tent after that time will be sold for show funds
- Prize money not collected by 4.30pm on 30th July will be taken as a donation to show funds
- Exhibits should be entered on the entry form included in this schedule (or a photocopy) and should be submitted with entry fees of 30p per class no later than Wednesday 27th July to one of the address on page 8 Late entries may be accepted but only at the discretion of the organisers who reserve the right to refuse entries submitted after this date
